Aged Care Services for Beverley residents

Recently, the Beverley Community Resource Centre (BCRC) have been exploring opportunities that would bring a higher level of care into the Community for aged residents. The Shire of Beverley is pleased to support this initiative and would encourage those in the community who might believe they are eligible to receive this service to visit the BCRC in the Cornerstone building and discuss your concerns with the staff.

The service is based upon the concept of 'Staying In Place' which translates into meaning that the Commonwealth Government recognise that, particularly with Aged Care, people can stay in their own homes for as long as possible. Not only stay in their own homes but more importantly, stay within their communities close to family and friends.

In summary, the programme is funded by the Commonwealth Government, engages Health Care Service Providers such as InCasa, Silver Chain, Baptist Care, and others to link those needing assistance with those in the community who are able to provide those services.

In terms of the BCRC, they have a contract with InCasa to assist in providing these services. The advantage of having the BCRC undertake this role means:

- Servicing local residents;
- Building a qualified workforce; and,
- Supporting economic development in Beverley.

At the moment there is a limited local service being offered to those in need but the new programme being offered will offer a greater flexibility for residents and can be specifically focused to particular areas. It isn't about providing just one standard service.

For those residents who are receiving outside assistance through other providers, I would encourage you to visit the BCRC and discuss your needs.

Street vandalism

On a more sombre note, it is sad to observe the wilful vandalism that is occurring around the town particularly in Vincent Street. Recent cases have seen damage to fencing, and damage from stones being thrown indiscriminately. Particularly, stones being thrown at people who have chosen to have a game of basketball in the Skate Park. It seems that these cases are not due to residents but blow-ins who seem to find amusement in attacking our community facilities.

Swimming Pool Grants

The Shire has received notification that it was successful in obtaining a grant of \$667,179 under the State Government Community Sporting Recreation Facilities Fund for Stage One of the Swimming Pool redevelopment.

We are also awaiting a decision from the Commonwealth Government on our application for funding of \$11,490,000 under the Regional Precincts and Partnerships Project (RPPP). This application would enable the Shire to carry out the complete redevelopment of the Swimming Pool as per the plan drawn up some years ago.

If this is unsuccessful, the Shire will commence the Stage One plan in April 2025.



BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents Tracking PC Hackett's Murderers - A Field Trip

Police Constable Patrick Hackett was murdered in Hunt Rd (opposite today's Police Station) on the evening of 11 September 1884. The two ex-convict murderers, Miller & Carbury, then stole horses & left Beverley in an attempt to escape justice. Over a period of four days, they were pursued by police. They headed south to Mourambine and then circled around by Corbedine Springs where a third exconvict, Brown, joined the pair. On the Dale River by Waterhatch the three men were met by a party of police officers & local men. A shoot-out ensued & Miller & Brown were killed. Carbury escaped but was caught a couple of days later at The Lakes. He went to trial, was convicted & hung in Perth Gaol.



Members & friends of Beverley Historical Society took a field trip last month to view some of the sites the murderers were known to have been seen.

One of these was Stock Hill ↑ where Mrs Grath at home by herself with two small children, secretly knew who they were & gave them food.

While at Mourambine we were kindly shown & informed of the history of St Patrick's Anglican Church. This church was built in 1873. The church has no electricity or water but is well-maintained by local parishioners.♥





Corbedine Spring \clubsuit flows into the Avon River north of Brookton. In 1884 it was the site of a small settlement where the murderers held up some residents, stealing food & guns. The ill-fated Brown threw in his lot with Miller & Carbury.



On through the valley of the Dale to Waterhatch where we are escorted through the farm paddocks to an area west of the river known as "Battle Flats".



Leaving the bus on the high ground \uparrow our group descended to the river's edge \checkmark and a large flat area with plenty of trees & rocks to provide cover from gunfire for the Police party, led by Sgt McKenna, & for the desperate fugitives.

Sgt McKenna, David Kilpatrick, Horace Smith & William Smith later received gold watches from the WA Government as a reward for their bravery.

Beverley Agricultural Museum News.

With increasing the openings to twice a month in March naturally additional activity has occurred, initially the extra Saturday was for the benefit of the public to view the large selection of farming machinery used from the early 1820's to mid-1970's in the Western Australian Wheatbelt region, so it is rewarding to see an increase in volunteers willing to give up their time to maintain and restore this exclusive collection.

The meeting on Saturday March 23 was extremely subdued compared to when our visitors from Bakers Hill assisted in starting and running several stationary engines previously on March 9, Eric continued work with the Holden Ute and finally got the Brake Master Cylinder to leave its home of many years nestled by the chassis under the floor, it's removal was quite an undertaking as he had to lay under the vehicle on the gravel floor. John A took it home to dismantle, assess and clean, Tim found a new repair kit at Rare Spares and the conquest is ongoing.

Paul & Bob spent their time between the International C30 Truck restoration with John Hawke discussing the need to repaint several of the panels and starting the 35X Fergusion Tractor. Kevin helped show one of the visitors from Perth around and Bill shared his mechanical knowledge.

Several visitors attended including two French tourists, two very informative members of the caravan club who were visiting the town, five locals and one lady from Perth whose daughter was doing work experience with a local farmer, unfortunately another two locals rocked up after the doors were locked.

to describe the activity, our new friends David Mac and son Jacob brought along another member from the Tracmach group, David Uren, with his knowledge and Jacob's abilities the fun soon began! 
The Ferry



INCASA COUNTRY 'STAYING IN PLACE' IS NOW ROLLING OUT IN BEVERLEY

InCasa Country has partnered with the Beverley CRC to assist older residents to get access to support services and care at home. The CRC is committed to helping our older residents, by cutting through the complexity of accessing federal funding and managing support care workers to better support you living at home.

Step 1 - Make an appointment at the CRC who will arrange an assessment with My Aged Care. To qualify for an assessment, you must meet these age requirements - you are 65 years or older (50 years or older for Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people).

Step 2 – My Aged Care assessment team will come out and do an at home assessment.

Step 3 – If you're eligible, My Aged Care will allocate you a Home Care Package.

Step 4 – Sign on with Incasa via the CRC, to develop and activate your Home Care Package.

Step 5 – The CRC will organise and manage a dedicated team of support workers for you.

What things can I access if I'm on a Home Care Package?

If you're eligible for a Home Care Package from the Commonwealth Government, funding is made available to assist with the costs in staying at home. *You may be eligible for:*

Personal Care - assisting you to perform essential self-care tasks

Domestic Assistance – supporting you to complete everyday household tasks **Home Maintenance** – Assistance with maintenance of your home and garden

Meal Assistance – Assisting with meal preparation or meal delivery

Transport Services – Helping you get to appointments or activities outside the home **Social Support** – Keeping you connected to your local community and hobbies **Respite Care** – Providing relief to carers

Clinical Care – Access and coordination of key health professionals to suit your individual care plan





How do I know if I could be eligible for a Home Care Package?

If you are over 65 and currently needing help at home due to health or mobility issues, please contact our office to make an appointment. A doctor's referral is **NOT** necessary.

What if I have a partner, would I still be eligible for a Home Care Package?

Absolutely, if you're over 65 and currently needing help at home due to health or mobility issue you may be eligible. Both partners, if eligible can receive a Home Care Package each.

What if I'm already receiving some home services but feel I need more help as I'm getting older, am I eligible?

If you are currently receiving home care services but your health or mobility is declining and you'd like more help at home, we can arrange a re-assessment through My Aged Care. Make an appointment at the CRC and we'll have an informal chat about your circumstances, discuss the next steps to ensure you stay happy and safe in your own home.



THE CWA OF WA STORY

The idea of a Country Women's Association first originated in Canada. A woman named Adelaide Hoodless first had the thought that awakened the difficulties of country women.

The movement moved to Australia in 1922 with New South Wales, then Queensland and then in 1923 Westen Australia. The Organisation was slow to start, but through the ongoing commitment of the women, 1924 was the year that the organisation finally made its presence known.

It was Lady Forster, who visited Western Australia in 1923, who first brought the idea to the women in Western Australia. With women like Mrs Manning, Mrs Trouchet, and Mrs Craven-Griffiths promoting the C.W.A, it wasn't long before the first branch would be formed. The first branch would be formed in Nungarin on July 7th, 1924. Another 3 branches were formed in that year.

Over the years many branches have formed, disbanded and some re-formed. Even though many members had to travel miles to attend meetings, fundraising events or just to attend events, it goes to show their commitment to the organisation and what they were all working towards, **'To improve the wellbeing of all'**.

Today, the CWA of WA is still working towards the same thing!

- pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy

- people aged 6 months and over with certain medical conditions that increase their risk of severe influenza and its complications.

Who should get vaccinated against shingles?

Free shingles vaccination under the National Immunisation Program (NIP) is available for eligible people most at risk of complications from shingles.

A 2-dose course of Shingrix is available for free for:

- people aged 65 years and over
- First Nations people aged 50 years and over
- immunocompromised people aged 18 years and over with the following medical conditions:
 - O haematopoietic stem cell transplant
 - O solid organ transplant
 - o haematological malignancy
 - o advanced or untreated HIV.






