President Report **January 2015**

Happy New Year

Hard to believe we are at the start of another year ... hope it has a few more days in it!

Ward Review

In October 2013 Council resolved to review the Wards and Boundary's as required by the Local Government Act 1995. The review was advertised in the May 2014 Beverley Blarney and IGA and CRC notice boards, calling for public comment. No responses were received and at the August 2014 Council Meeting it was resolved to remove the Ward voting structure within the Shire of Beverley. A subsequent application was submitted to the Local Government Advisory Board (LGAB) requesting that the Ward structure for Councillor representation within the Beverley Shire be removed and a response is expected from the LGAB in the near future. Removing Wards will enable electors to vote on all Councillor nominations at the next Local Government Elections, better reflecting what is currently occurring, in that Councillors collectively view the whole Shire their responsibility. The next Local Government elections will be held in October 2015

Railway Station

The Shire is awaiting information as to the extent and cost of remediation works required to have the Railway Station building back into action. Community support has already seen donations offered toward this project and Council is investigating the establishment of a Trust Fund for our heritage buildings.

Work is underway toward installation of a toilet block for use when events and activities are held at the Station Cultural Arts Precinct. It is hoped this will be completed in the New Year and available for scheduled events and activities at the Platform Theatre.

Water Harvesting Project

A Water Harvest Project Planning

Report has been endorsed by Council as the basis for a grant application to the Department of Water to progress the first stage of Street Water Harvesting in Beverley.

The proposal includes construction and secure fencing of two retention basins at the eastern end of John St and Edwards st to collect storm water from kerbed bituminised town streets which will then be pumped to the town dam for irrigation of parks and the recreation oval. The Report is available for viewing at the Shire office.

Declining Internet and Mobile service in Beverley

Following various enquiries information has been provided that the requirement for mobile and data coverage now is much greater than the network was originally designed for and this can cause connectivity problems. There is more bandwidth due to be released early in the New Year.

Another issue which may be causing problems in Beverley is that of illegal mobile repeaters. It is lawful to install and operate one with the approval of an authorised telecommunications carrier; however illegal repeaters can cause substantial interference to the mobile network due to an absence of co-ordination with other telecommunication infrastructure. The seriousness of this is reflected in the penalties for the possession or operation of an unlicensed repeater, which may include up to two years imprisonment or a fine up to \$165,000.

Mobile boosters can also cause problems and the operation, supply and possession of boosters has been prohibited by the Australian Communications and Media Authority.

A request has been made to investigate if the use of illegal repeaters and prohibited boosters is adding to the problems Beverley is currently experiencing.

Community Information Notice regarding Council Decisions

There has been discussion in our community regarding some decisions of Council and I would like to provide clarification around these for our community's information. No decision of Council is made lightly or for no reason, and is ultimately directed toward providing adequate and affordable services and facilities for our ratepayers, residents and electors, within consideration of long term sustainability for the Shire of Beverley.

The State Governments' Local Government Reform Programme seeks to create a process of continuous improvement across the sector with Councils required to develop Integrated Planning and Reporting Frameworks including plans such as the Strategic Community Plan, Corporate Business Plan, Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plan (plus others).

In 2012 our rate payers and electors gave Council a very clear mandate there was limited support toward continuing with the South East Avon Regional Transition Group and potentially amalgamation, additionally, that amalgamation was not a preferred option at all for our community.

Improving sustainability, addressing efficiencies, regional collaboration, and fostering economic development in the district, will place the Shire in a stronger position to argue against amalgamation. It is unknown if rural Local Government will be the focus of amalgamations once the Metropolitan reform is completed.

The Department of Local Government has also developed a series of financial ratios, which when applied determine if the Local Government is or has the potential to become sustainable with appropriate planning over the long term.

Beverley's Long Term Financial Plan includes a proposed 6% annual rate increase over 10 years which facilitates an improvement in our financial ratios. The actual rate each year is determined as the budget is developed and it is Councils' decision to set the rate depending on the community's needs and expectations based on the Integrated Planning process.

The Asset Management Plans have been a real eye opener. The annual funding shortfall for asset management, renewal and replacement is alarming. This has encouraged many Local Governments to commence planning to rationalise and consolidate the infrastructure they are responsible for, removing it from their Asset Registers altogether. Renewal costs, including expenditure to conform to current building and universal access standards for public buildings requires evaluation against potential use of the space, social benefit gained and associated cost to the ratepayer.

This was the basis of Councils decision not to expend any more funds on the Infant Health Building and initiate its removal, whilst also seeking community support and external funding for a proposed multipurpose facility to service the needs of the community and contribute to the economic growth and development of the district. Any proposals need to be considered in terms of not just the capital cost, but whole of life costs including the operational, maintenance and replacement costs with a business case to determine if feasible.

Additionally, Council over the last few years has also been reviewing and updating agreements and arrangements with community groups who have had access to what is essentially exclusive use of property the Council is responsible for on behalf of our rate payers and/or State Government. This has included groups such as the Pony Club, Gliding Club, Motorcross, BORMSA and more recently Hospital Auxiliary, all groups worthy in their own right.

Beverley, Brookton and Pingelly Shires Sign Agreement to Engage Audit Services on Age Care Solutions for the Three Communities

Back in January this year the Shire Presidents and CEOs from Beverley, Brookton and Pingelly held a meeting to discuss aged care and resources within our three communities.

At this meeting we formed a working group now called the BBP. This group consists of the Shire President, CEO and a Councillor from each of the Councils. This working group was also formalised with each Council agreeing to enter and sign an MOU as the BBP.

Since January the BBP have met every second month to discuss topics regarding aged care, funding, community expectations, community needs and how we can improve our current facilities and services.

The BBP is considering a study tour to Sheffield in Tasmania in 2015 to look at some best practice designs and facilities that will assist our communities. To conduct this study tour the three Shires have made a budget allocation for this financial year subject to gaining external funding.

The BBP is also committed to working with the Wheatbelt Development Commission on these key projects along the way and value their support.

It is felt by all involved with the BBP that this is an exciting initiative and alliance between the three Shires with huge potential.

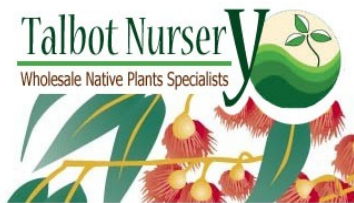

Beverley farmers get high speed support on the NBN

1 December 2014 – Hundreds of Telstra customers in Beverley can now connect to the National Broadband Network (NBN) using speedy fixed wireless technology.

It offers fast and reliable download speeds, giving local farmers the opportunity to work more efficiently with suppliers and build their businesses effectively without leaving home.

"I learnt that Miss Annie Lucy Robins was the first teacher" wrote Jayme.

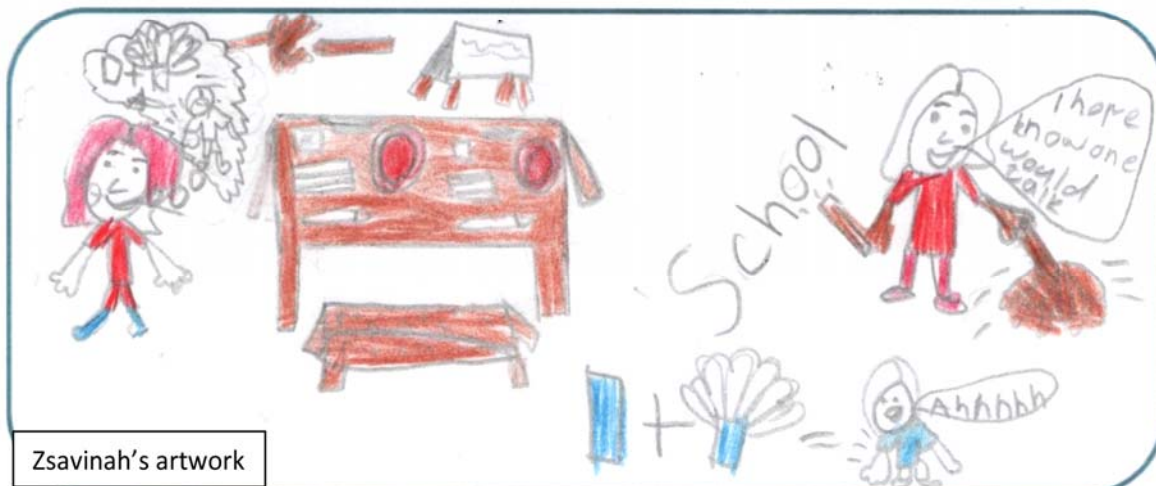
"I learnt that Beverley is interesting" said Hayden. "The Museum is the oldest place in Beverley" wrote Jamie-Lee.

Anyway, yes, by the time you read this we'll have worked all over Christmas AND New Year (cue the violins). 2015 will be in full swing and will be waiting to dish out whatever it feels like so we'd better strap ourselves in for what comes to our doors.....

So, what's happening ?

Sssshhhhh..... we are travelling very well with regards to our crime figures. We've had a stealing from one of our rural properties of a quantity of copper wire. I know it's difficult for us to be everywhere at all times and trust me when I say that we do carry out remote patrols regularly. Cyclone Tracey Darwin Christmas 1974

It was 40 years ago when Judy and I were living in Darwin when cyclone Tracey hit us on Christmas eve. I was at work at Radio Australia on Cox Peninsula when Tracey hit us and first wiped-out the radio station. I took shelter with another technician in a steel container while the antenna masts came crashing down on the building. Tracey hammered us for about 6 hours and when it cleared, we tried to get back to the mainland but all the boats were sunk.

After several hours on the beach, a prawning vessel came to shore to pick us up and took us back to the Darwin wharf. The boat captain told us that the northern suburbs where we lived were completely wiped out and many lives lost. This news shattered us as we did not know if we had a family to go back to.

After 28 hours from leaving home I finally got back to our residence to see the top part of the house demolished, leaving a big dance floor. It was a relief to see Judy, the mother in law and the 4 children emerging from a room, still in tack beneath the dance floor.

Judy received news earlier that the vessel we travel to work on was sunk and all aboard perished. This placed a great mental strain on the family, until I turned up and we were all re united. Judy and the family were evacuated out by a Galaxy aircraft 2 days later. While I stayed behind to help rebuild and clean up Darwin. Judy returned after 3 months, when I had temporary accommodation prepared and the 4 children 12 months later when the house was rebuilt.

Both Judy and I have had traumatic experience during the height of cyclone Tracey but we kept it to ourselves and did not go running to the press to tell our stories. We nearly lost our youngest daughter during Tracey's ferocity. One of these days I will get around to writing a book on the event, it is still quite vivid in our memories.

One does not realise how violent mother nature can be until you experience the ferocity of cyclone like Tracey. One thing on the humorous side, when I put the mother in law on the plane to be evacuated out, she grabbed my hand and looked me in the eyes and said "Barrie, promise me that you will never give me a Christmas like that again." She was visiting from Adelaide as her husband died 12 month so she sais she was glad to be here as she would have been worrying sick if she was still in Adelaide.

40 years on, boy have Judy and I travelled a long road since.

Welcome to summer! The weather is getting warmer and the flies are starting to buzz.

As pastures start to hay off it is important to monitor stock for grass seeds. They can become lodged in animals' coats, eyes and ears. If the seeds are not removed they can cause sores and abscesses.

It is important to check that fences are secure, as stock will start to seek better food through the fence. If you need to supplementary feed, it is better to put the feed into troughs rather than on the dirt to avoid causing digestion problems, such as colic in horses.

If you are running out of feed for your animals, remnant bush and your gardens are not good sources of feed. Grazing remnant bush encourages erosion and degradation and your animals may also be poisoned. Your garden may also have plants that are poisonous to livestock.

Grazing is rapidly removing dry protective pasture from paddocks. Plan to have a small sacrificial paddock to place stock once plant matter is reduced to around 50% ground cover. This is to prevent overgrazing on your property and the likelihood of wind erosion.

Now is the time to soil-test paddocks to determine next year's fertiliser requirements. Soil-test kits are available from your local rural trader.

Dams in low-lying areas prone to salinity will need monitoring to ensure the electrical conductivity (measure of salt) is below the thresholds for livestock (1100mS/m for ewes and lambs or 1600mS/m for adult wethers).

Watch out for algae in dams and troughs; as the weather heats up algae will need to be regularly cleaned out of troughs, and dams will need to be monitored and treated if necessary. Monitor soil moisture and irrigate as required. Maintain a suitable nutrition program, adjusting as required to suit crop load. January is the month for leaf analysis of stone fruit and pome fruit.

Summer prune deciduous plants, especially the more vigorous species such as grapevines and stone fruit. This will reduce tree size and allow light to lower parts of the tree to help improve fruit colour.

Baiting for rabbits during the next few months can prove beneficial later in the year. At this time numbers are low and green food is scarce increasing bait uptake. Landowners may not consider rabbits a problem at this time of year but not carrying out control actions can lead to growth in populations during the winter.

Wheatbelt tower launch marks telecommunications milestone

Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies MLA said the activation of two new mobile phone towers at Flint and Mawby this week marks a huge overall increase in telecommunication connectivity in regional WA.

Flint in the Shire of Beverley and Mawby in the Shire of Serpentine-Jarrahdale were the final towers launched under the \$40 million Regional Mobile Communications Project (RMCP), funded by the Royalties for Regions program.

Ms Davies said a total of 113 new communications towers had now been installed, increasing regional mobile coverage in WA by 22 per cent – the equivalent of 95,000sqkm.

“Breaking down the digital divide in the bush is essential to connecting communities, improving emergency service capabilities, supporting business and opening up new economic opportunities,” she said.

“The rollout of RMCP has vastly improved telecommunications in the Wheatbelt, which is now home to 16 new towers and many happy mobile phone and wireless device users.”

Other Wheatbelt sites to have received RMCP towers and improved telecommunications include Bencubbin, Mukinbudin, Narembeen, Ballidu, Koorda and Kondinin.

Agricultural Region MP Paul Brown MLC, who joined Regional Development Minister Terry Redman and Beverley Shire President Dee Ridgway at the Flint launch, said RMCP had provided enormous benefits to the community.

“That improved liveability and sustainability of regional, rural and remote communities will be augmented when the State Government begins rolling out the Regional Telecommunications Project (RTP) early next year,” he said.

“The RTP will bring more than 80 additional new phone towers to regional and strategic locations, further improving telecommunications and connectivity.”

Beverley Shire President Dee Ridgway said the Flint project tower had dramatically improved coverage along Brookton Highway for the travelling public and would create an opportunity to attract people to the area who were previously concerned with connectivity.

“It’s obviously a huge bonus for emergency service teams operating in the area as well as improving the public’s safety,” she said.

“The project itself is very impressive, incorporating renewable energy to power the site and we look forward to the broader rollout of the RTP project in years to come.”

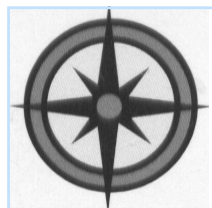



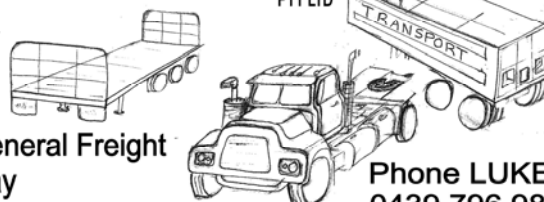
