Rates Reminder

Please remember that in order to receive the 10% discount on your rate notice, full payment must be received by Tuesday 8th September 2015.

Local Government Nominations 2015

Council nominations for the forthcoming Local Government elections open on Thursday 3rd September and close Thursday 10th September. The Shire of Beverley has 5 vacancies. Information regarding nominations can be obtained from the Department of Local Government, www.elections.wa.gov.au or contact the Shire office.

Road Counter Vandalism - your assistance is needed

From time to time the Shires road counters are deliberately damaged. Sometimes repairs can be made, and if not a replacement costs several thousand of rate payers dollars. The data collected from these counters is used in planning for roadworks in the Shire. Importantly, this information also supports funding applications for road upgrades, as was the case with the recently ruined counter on Westdale Rd. The counters are generally left in situ for around 6 weeks, and with that data now not available a funding opportunity may have been missed. Any information to the Shire regarding this vandalism would be appreciated as Councils preference is to be allocating funds to repairing roads rather than replacing road counters.

Railway Station Repairs

Quotes have been called for the structural repairs required for the Railway Station, with works expected to commence in September.

Dale Kokeby Rd – Corbeding Rd

To remove confusion for emergency services Council has supported a name change for a section of Dale Kokeby Rd. The change will occur from the intersection of Corbeding, Dale Kokeby and Hillcroft Roads where the former section of Dale Kokeby Rd will become a continuance of Corbeding Rd through to York Williams Rd.

Water Harvesting Project

Council supported the water harvesting project in the 15/16 budget and a successful grant application has been received from the Department of Water for \$100,000. A loan is proposed for the balance of required funds. The project is expected to commence within the

financial year.

Road Maintenance

Maintenance grading has been carried out on the following roads:- Spaven, Walgy, Edison Mill, Rogers, Dale Bin North, Deep Pool and Bennett. Shoulder grading has been undertaken on Top Beverley Rd, Waterhatch Rd, Talbot Rd and Kokendin Rd and tree lopping on Edison Mill Rd and North Bin Rd.

Gym

Two new treadmills and a rowing machine will be installed in the gym in September. This could perhaps be time to consider a membership and get the body ready for summer!

Draft Urban Design Project – feedback request

A draft urban design proposal for redevelopment of the Vincent St precinct is on display in the Shire office window and on the Shire website. The discussion proposal has been prepared by the Shire Planner taking into account feedback obtained from a prior rate-payer survey, UWA landscape architecture Studio One18 ideas, a study trip to the 2014 Mainstreet SA conference in Gawler and the Planners prior experience in urban design projects. Investigation of “Localised Enhancement Project” funding which aims to beautify urban gateways, scenic routes and tourism/heritage centres, particularly in regional towns by placing power underground is being undertaken. Feedback on the draft design proposal is being sought until the end of September 2015.

Fire Break Order

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS - CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

How to become an Elected Member (Councillor)

If you want to make a difference in your community and have a say in local decision making, stand for election as a local government Councillor. There are many benefits from being involved in your local council; namely the sense of satisfaction you will achieve from serving your community and being involved in making important decisions for the future.

The decision to stand for Council is a very personal one and you must consider your own circumstances and decide whether you are able to make the commitment required.

Nomination Requirements

Candidates are required to make an appointment with the Returning Officer (CEO) to lodge:

- A completed nomination in the prescribed form signed and witnessed.
- A single A4 page profile containing not more than 150 words of biographical information about the nominee can include statements of the candidate's policies or beliefs
- A non-refundable, nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order)
- A recent passport-sized photograph (optional)

When an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, the candidate must fill in the prescribed form with a written authorisation and sign it.

STRONGER COMMUNITIES PROGRAMME

I am writing to you to make you aware of a Coalition Government initiative that I believe may be relevant to you, your organisation, or any other local not-for-profit group in your community. The *Stronger Communities Programme* is a programme designed to fund small capital projects for reputable not-for-profit organisations. The programme's objective is to yield significant social benefits, improve local community participation and contribute to vibrant and viable communities.

Under the programme funding of \$150,000 per year over two years will be available to support projects in the Pearce electorate. Applicants can seek a grant of at least \$5,000 and up to a maximum of \$20,000 and must match the *Stronger Communities Programme* grant in cash or in-kind on at least a dollar for dollar basis. Guidelines for the *Stronger Communities Programme* can be found on the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development website www.infrastructure.gov.au/scp and I encourage you to read through them.

I have established a Community Consultation Committee to assist in identifying and considering worthwhile projects within our electorate. If you can identify a project within your community that falls within the *Stronger Communities Programme* guidelines please have the not-for-profit organisation complete and return the enclosed Expression of Interest form to my office by **16 September 2015**, by emailing annette.livesey@aph.gov.au.

The Expressions of Interest will be appraised against the guidelines to ensure that all eligibility requirements are met and to ascertain whether funding the project would be a proper use of this grant funding. Successful Expressions of Interest will be invited to apply for project funding and will be provided access to the Department's online application process. Online applications for this funding close on **30 October 2015**.

I believe that the community of Pearce will benefit greatly from this particular programme and I look forward to seeing new local projects being undertaken for a stronger community. COMPULSORY MICROCHIPPING FOR ALL DOGS AS OF 1 NOVEMBER 2015

The Shire of Beverley has received notice from the Department of Local Government and Communities that from 1 November 2015 it is compulsory for all dogs to be microchipped.

Amendments to the *Dog Act 1976* made in November 2013 provided that from 1 November 2015 the owner of a dog that has reached 3 months of age must ensure the dog is microchipped.

A dog is exempt from the microchipping requirement if a veterinarian issues a certificate stating that the implantation of a microchip may adversely affect the health and welfare of the dog. The certificate cannot apply in respect of a dog that is under three months of age.

When a person registers their dog, they will be required to provide proof that the dog has been microchipped by providing their local government with the microchip number.

If you lose your microchipped dog, it will make it easier for you to be reunited. The dog's microchip can be scanned by the ranger or a vet, which will reveal the owner's contact details.

If your dog is impounded and it is discovered that it has not been microchipped, you may be liable for a fine. As a result, it is in your best interests to ensure your dog is microchipped.

A person who fails to ensure their dog is microchipped on and after 1 November 2015 is liable for a fine of up to \$5,000.

RATES

Property owners would have received their Annual Rates Notice. There are two options to paying your rates.

Option 1 is to pay **in full** by the due date and receive a **10% discount**.
The Early Payment Incentive **cannot be granted after** the due date of **08 September 2015**.

Option 2 is to pay in four instalments, with the first payment due as above. This option attracts several additional charges which are explained on your rates notice.

Due by the following dates:

1st Instalment	08 September 2015
2nd Instalment	10 November 2015
3rd Instalment	12 January 2016
4th Instalment	14 March 2016

If the 1st Instalment is not paid by the due date you cannot join the Instalment Plan. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS. An interest component of 5.5% is charged on the second, third and fourth instalments to cover loss of investment income and extra administration to the Shire of Beverley. Instalments not received by the due dates listed above will incur 11% interest penalty for each day the instalment is late.

Please note that, as a last resort, any outstanding rate balances will be handed to a debt collection agency to recover the amount owing.

In certain circumstances a special payment arrangement can be entered into inline with council's policy. If you are having **problems paying your rates**, please contact the Rates Officer on 08 9646 1200 to explore your options.

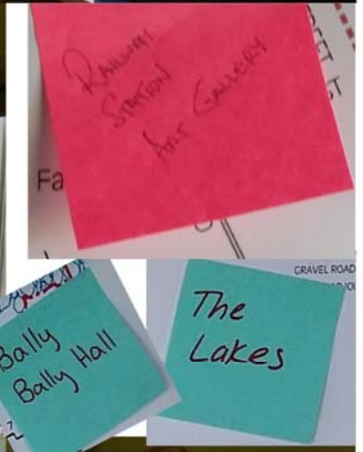

Cleaning tips

The following tips will help to ensure your difficult-to-clean eligible farm chemical containers will be accepted for recycling at your local *drumMUSTER* collection centre.



Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)

- ✓ Rinse your container immediately after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry



- ✓ Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing.

Oil-based chemicals (ULVs, LVs)

- ✓ Follow specific instructions on the product label or contact the manufacturer for further assistance



Other chemical residues

- ✓ Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry
- ✓ Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)



- ✓ A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue



- ✓ **ELIGIBLE CONTAINERS WITH DIRT, RUST AND DYE STAINS ARE NOT CONSIDERED HAZARDOUS AND ARE THEREFORE ACCEPTED AT *drumMUSTER* COLLECTION CENTRES**

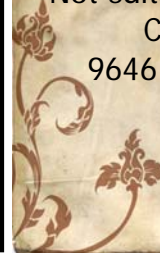

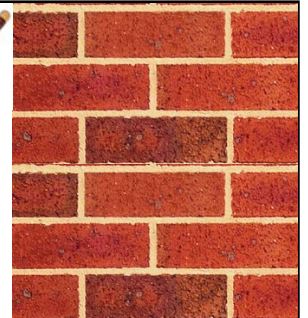

Competition was fierce in the schedule entries with some really delicious products and beautiful work on display.



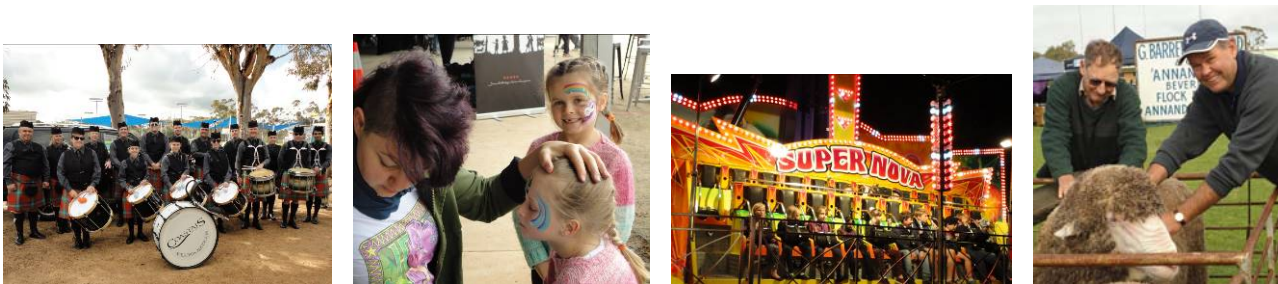
The entertainment started at 9am with people enjoying themselves all day and finished late with a wonderful firework display.

Albany to Perth by Train in 1891 - as seen by a young lad from Cornwall aged 15 from the Memoirs of Frank Lodge (1947)

Arriving in WA (Late May 1891)

We saw no land and few passing ships between Ceylon and Cape Leeuwin. On reaching King George Sound we went on and anchored in the Inner Harbour off the very small town of Albany in its beautiful setting. I had expected a busy seaport and was surprised at the empty harbour with its two small jetties which our ship did not go near. We unloaded our 5 passengers, 7 mailbags and a couple of barge loads of other goods. We said farewell to our fellow passengers (I disliked leaving the ship) went on shore in a steam tug with Mr Earnest Parry who had come out to meet Tom [Lodge, my cousin] and his family. They took me to the Freemasons Hotel where I stayed. It was a very modest two storied hotel then. Tom and Connie went on to stay with Mr and Mrs Parry at their house. Earnest Parry was the son of the Bishop of Perth, his wife a daughter of Sir Malcolm Fraser, West Australia's Agent General in London. (Her brother was Hugh Fraser who lived in Beverley for many years, a cripple)

Albany

I felt lonely in my small room at the hotel. I missed the motion of the ship, and did not sleep till late. Continuous sheet lightning in the far distance puzzled me as to what it could be, and incessant croaking of frogs in the still night was strange. The next morning as arranged I went up to Mr Parry's house, saw their boys Willie, Ted, Tom (a small lad with long curls) and Les in a cradle. Years afterwards Les worked for me at East Yangedine, and was killed at the landing on Gallipoli.

After lunch Tom told me to walk into town, find the cab which was sure to be in the main street, and get the cabman to drive me back to Mr Parry's. I could see no cab and at last asked two men who were talking outside the hotel, near a vehicle with a white canvas awning where I could find a cab. One called out to a youth sitting on the curb "*Hey Jim, here's a young bloke from London looking for the cab.*" The vehicle I had seen within 10 yards of me was 'the cab'. I had been looking for a closed English 'Growler'. I drove off noticing the grins at my expense. [...]

On the Great Southern Railway

We spent another night in Albany and the next morning at 8 o'clock started in the train for Perth, Mr Parry travelling with us as far as Broomehill, near which place he had the management of a large farm on the Pallinup River, belonging to a Mr Powell who was, I think, a contractor builder of the Great Southern Railway, Albany to Beverley. At Broomehill we had dinner at the Hotel. Turnips and pork, or mutton chops the only choice. All the train passengers sat at a long table in the hotel dining room. There were no refreshment rooms in the station at that time. I suppose the train crew, engine driver, fireman and guard had their meals in another room. Lambert who died in Albany a few months ago at a very advanced age was the guard of the train. I was surprised to see Tom 'shouting' a drink to the train crew at the bar. He seemed to know them.

All the way from Albany to Perth we travelled through an unending forest of small timber. The only open country consisted of a few small fields at very long intervals and an occasional scrubby sand plain. We could see nothing of the surrounding country. I do not even remember seeing the high Stirling Ranges, though surely they must have been visible from some part of the line. At intervals of every few miles the train stopped at recognised stopping places, with no platform or siding, and two or three horsemen would be there getting their mail, or a man with a cart sending away a bundle of kangaroo skins, a few fowls in a crate, or other small articles. Several trucks of sandal wood, consisting of small crooked barked stakes were attached to the train. The towns of Broomehill, Katanning, Wagin, Narrogin and Pingelly were all very small, with railway stations and goods sheds. Most of the inhabitants seemed to come on to the platform to see the train come in. I was astonished to find that in nearly all places there was someone who knew Tom, and spoke to him, and I began to think that everybody in Western Australia knew everyone else.

Beverley

After Broomehill everyone on the train talked of "*When we get to Beverley*". Beverley was the terminus of the Great Southern Railway then privately owned, and there we had to stay the night as trains did not run at night. I supposed Beverley to be a town of some significance, perhaps a thousand inhabitants. It was dark when we got there so I saw nothing of it, and did not know till months afterwards that it consisted of 3 hotels, 2 stores, a Post Office and Police Station over ¼ mile from the Railway, and not more than a dozen very scattered houses. Tom and Connie were greeted by the station master James Drake Brockman, by Mr Horace Smith, and one or two others. We made our way carrying our light luggage along the dark road to the Freemasons Hotel about 300 yards from the station. Mr Hawkin Sewell was the proprietor and lived at the hotel. There was a blazing fire in the dining room, and sitting at the long table with Mr Sewell at one end, Mrs Sewell and her four small daughters, Una, Rossy, Connie and Madeline at the other, we were waited on by Mr Sewell's oldest daughters Adelaide and Grace to a plentiful meal of mutton chops or kangaroo and pork, with homemade bread, jam, butter and cream. Later on we went to our bedrooms on the top floor, up a steep ladder-like stairway outside. Hundreds of frogs seemed to be croaking everywhere round the hotel as I went to sleep. Next morning after a good breakfast of porridge, 'mutton chop or bacon and eggs' we boarded the train just as day was breaking. From Beverley on, more homesteads with small areas of cleared fields around them were in sight, and a fair quantity of ring-barked country with its skeleton looking trees, but most of the land was still in its green forest state with the white barked gums looking very peculiar to English eyes.

York to East Perth

York was a picturesque little town with towered church and hills round about. On the station we saw old Horton the mail carrier, who for many years met every train with his bus. Tom saw more acquaintances on the platform and seemed to know the owners of every farm house we saw from the train. We passed through Spencer Brook with its one hotel and no other house, the junction for Northam, and Clackline, the junction for Newcastle as Toodyay was then called. Here Mrs Kimberley sold 6d paper bags of fruit to the train passengers for very many years. After Clackline we entered the jarrah forest which is much the same today except that there is now a number of houses and fruit gardens at intervals. At Chidlows Well we stopped for dinner at the Oxford Inn kept by Mr Simmonds "Kangaroo and pork or mutton chops". The Midland Railway from Midland Junction to Geraldton was, I think, in course of construction. After the rather English-looking little town of Guildford we travelled through bush country till we reached East Perth.

Perth

Perth was perhaps 1/10 of the size I expected to find in the Capital City. There were a few cabs and two or three hansom cabs, but no buses or trams. St Georges Terrace had a few solid buildings, banks, etc and some nice resident's houses near the river. Mount Street did not exist, and the town practically ended at the Barracks, Hay Street petered out into sand a little past the Wesleyan Church, and there was nothing but bush and sand between Perth and Fremantle with the exception of a few scattered garden blocks with houses, the halfway hotel "Bullens" at Cottesloe and a very few houses on the river bank. [...] Tom took me and my luggage to the Shamrock Hotel, an unpretentious 2 storey building where the Surrey Hotel stands at present. I had a comfortable room with candle for light, and meals were clean and good, with tea at every meal, the usual custom.

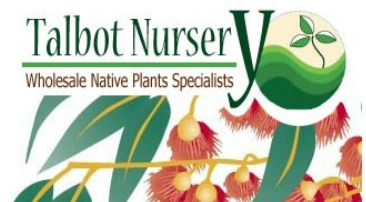

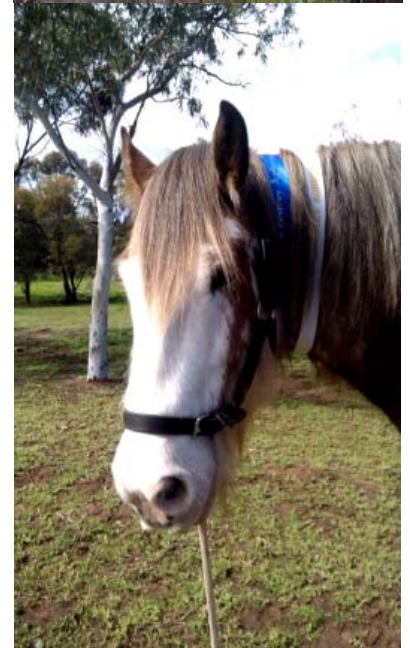

Roads Policing (or traffic work as it used to be known)

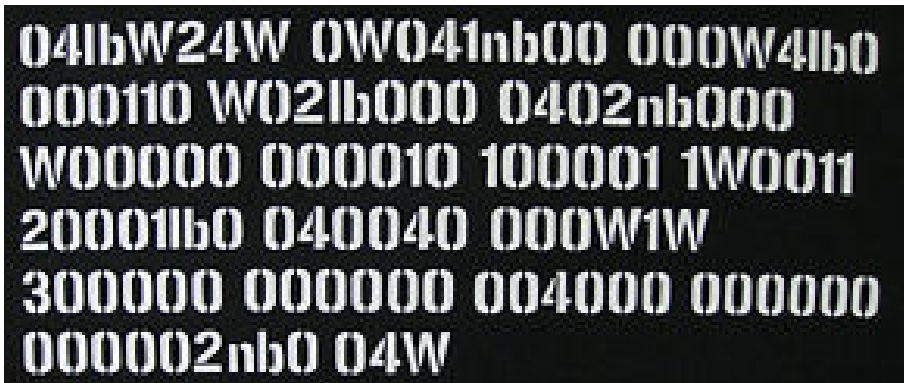

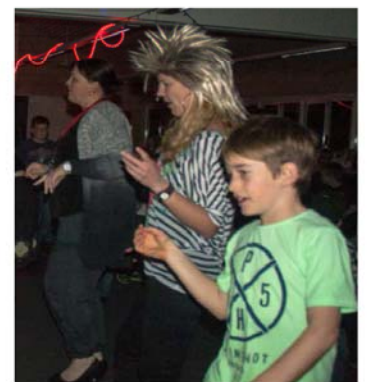

Witches Kangaroo Rescue and Wildlife Care

I was called out earlier this month to a Kangaroo on Waterhatch Rd and when I got there I was shocked by what I found a beautiful male Euro had been shot and left in the middle of the road. I rang DPAW and reported this illegal act and also inquired about the law regarding wildlife in Beverley. I was told that all wildlife is protected under the act no matter where it is and is not allowed to be harassed injured or killed. This means you cannot go around and shoot wildlife anywhere without a licence to do so. I have also discovered that the Euro Kangaroo is fully protected in Beverley and cannot be shot at all. If you shoot Euro's in Beverley you can and will be prosecuted and very strict penalties apply. The Euro is the red coloured kangaroos that you see around Beverley many people call them Reds but we do not have red kangaroos in Beverley. We have also had an increased activity of people cutting fences and trying to shoot kangaroos in our bush reserves. No shooting is allowed anywhere except on private property with permission from the property owner and this means the property owner shares responsible if you shoot wildlife illegally.

If you are a land owner and having a problem with wildlife you can ring DPAW and they will advise you of what your options are and issue appropriate licences to solve the problem. We have increased patrols around our bush Reserves especially the Reserve on the dump road to catch the people illegally killing our kangaroos in our reserves. If you are caught you will be prosecuted. I have also spoken to the Police firearms licensing division and they have advised me that no one can shoot anywhere except private property with permission or in special areas like raffle clubs. You cannot shoot in any National Parks or Reserves or any land managed by the Crown or State Government or Local Government and you are definitely not allowed to shoot anywhere near roads except if you are a Ranger or Police officer or authorised to humanely shoot injured animals on roadsides and this is done with strict rules.

We had a call out to Brookton the other day to a Possum this little fella was in shock and sitting on a letterbox at an empty house. He doesn't appear to be injured but something must have happened to his mum and the poor little guy was so scared to move and sat all day on this letter box. The lady who spoke to my daughter at Stumpy's roadhouse saved his life. He is responding well and should make a full recovery.

Female Euro's are a lot smaller and are grey/red in colour and they tend to live in small family groups of about 10 to 12 kangaroos.

Healthy Body – Healthy Mind

Recipe Corner

Following on from last month's article about eating raw, I have included some of my favourite raw recipes for you to try yourself. So for all these people who would like to try some basic raw food, I have included raw porridge, raw soup, crackers, a salad and a dip. These are our stand by raw food we can always fall back on.

*A note on dehydrators. They come in all shapes and sizes. In our household we have the Excalibur 9 - tray version. 9 square trays, I have added 5 teflex sheets. Teflex sheets are flexible sheets that are coated with a DuPont Teflon surface for preparing your fruit leather, rollups, sweet treats, and for the cracker mix. The food peels off quickly and clean up is easy.

Raw Buckwheat Porridge

(Buckwheat is gluten free, so can be enjoyed by people with gluten intolerance)

This makes four 1 cup servings.

2 cups raw buckwheat kernals, soaked in water for a minimum of 2 hours, drained and rinsed several times until water is clear

1 ¼ cups almond milk

(making your own nut milk will be covered next month)

2 tablespoons chia seeds

¼ cup liquid sweetener (Agave Syrup, maple syrup or honey)

Pinch of sea salt

1 tsp cinnamon

Place Buckwheat kernels in food processor along with almond milk, chia seeds and vanilla. Process until combined and slightly smooth. Now add sweetener and cinnamon to taste

Scoop into bowls or parfait glasses and add your desired toppings & mix-ins.

Add toppings (berries, fruit and chopped almonds or any fresh fruit in season.)

Eat at room temperate. Left over keeps well in fridge to be enjoyed later or next day.

Raw Flax Crackers

1 cup flax seed brown or golden

3 tablespoons chia seed

3 tablespoons sunflower seed

3 tablespoons raw pepita (pumpkin kernels)

1 tablespoons tamari (wheat free soy sauce)

1 tablespoon spices (mix of dried herbs)

1 ½ cup water

Place all in large bowl, pour water over, mix with spatula until everything is combined, let stand for 1-2 hours, stir sometimes, add small amounts of water if too thick. This will be a very sticky thick paste.

Place on the teflex sheets of your dehydrator, spread out all over the sheet with a wet spatula or wet hands, score to your size and dehydrate for about 8 hours, turn over the tray, remove teflex sheet, dehydrate for another 6 hours until dry.

*Note: I make this double because we eat them all the time. Eat with home made nut butter or tahini.

How to make nut butters and nut milk will be covered

some other time.

Raw Broccoli & Carrot Soup

2 cups warm water

1 whole broccoli including stalks

2 carrots

1 stick celery

1 whole tomato

1/3 zucchini

Handful of nuts or nut butter

¼ tsp sea salt, spices such as ginger, garlic with peel, chilli.

Place all in high speed blender or your Vitamix and blend 3-4 minutes. Soup will be very warm but still considered raw.

Raw Beetroot Salad

1 cup shredded beetroot including young leafs

1 cup greens such as silver beet or kale shredded

1 cup cabbage green or red, shredded

1 carrot shredded including green tops

Handful of your favourite sprouts

(alfalfa, mung beans, and lentils)

Juice of ½ lemon

8-10 olives, pitted and chopped

1 tablespoon dulse flakes (sea weed)

1 tablespoon sunflower seeds roasted,

1 tablespoon raw hemp seed

1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil

Place all in large bowl, toss and let stand for about an hour at room temperature.

Raw Sunflower Dip

1 cup sunflower seeds, soaked for about 8 hours and rinsed until clear

1 tablespoons tamari (wheat free soy sauce)

5 sundried tomatoes soaked together with sunflowers, rinsed

1 tablespoon dulse flakes (sea weed),

Juice of ½ lemon

1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil

Place all ingredients in your food processor and process until creamy. Scrape down sides of bowl several times and push into the blades. Keep processing until you have a nice thick creamy dip. Add some more oil and lemon juice if you want. Eat with the raw crackers.

Classic Raw Chia Seed Pudding

4 tablespoons chia seed

1 cup almond or other nut milk

1 tablespoon raw cacao powder

Pour milk in glass bowl,

Stir in chia seed and whisk for 2-3 minutes until chia is absorbed and not lumpy

Add cacao powder, whisk until smooth

Place in fridge for 2 hours or leave over night

When chia is thick add your toppings: berries, fresh fruit, chopped nuts, drizzle of honey, agave syrup or marble syrup.

This makes a wonderful breakfast!

The rain has been very beneficial for our gardens but the cold has kept most of us inside but the weeds will get away, so weeding is essential just now. Pruning and tidying can be done until it gets a bit warmer.

September, the first day of spring! It is such a lovely vibrant time of year, with the wild flowers in full bloom baby animals frolicking in the paddocks and plenty to do around the property. Landholders who have vegetable gardens will be well rewarded with their fruits of labour. Strawberries will crop well all spring and, to avoid slaters, they grow best in full sun in hanging baskets.

If you have pruning to do, spend a few minutes maintaining your pruning equipment. By having sharp tools free from rust and build-up of plant material your job will be easier and cuts will be cleaner, reducing the risk of introducing diseases. Prune passionfruit and begin fruit thinning to reduce over cropped fruit trees. Thinning crops now will provide you with more evenly sized fruit and encourage your trees to produce similar amounts of fruit the following year.

Don't get complacent with your pest control. Snails, slaters, fruit fly other pests need to be controlled regularly during spring. Also, ensure that you maintain a regular fertiliser program all spring.

If you carried out any revegetation over the winter months you will need to check the health of your plants and monitor/ manage emerging weeds as warmer days and good soil moisture provides ideal conditions for growth.

Now is a good time to start implementing your fire management programme, reduce fuel load around your house and sheds, install fire breaks and review your fire management plan. It is also important to contact your local council, as regulations vary in some shires. For more information about fire prevention contact the Department of Fire and Emergency Service (DEFS) at dfes.wa.gov.au

Weather condition may also lead to pasture production exceeding the consumption levels of your livestock. If this occurs consider slashing pasture which has gone rank. This will provide opportunity for new pasture to emerge and control fuel loads later in the season. Also, if you intend on cutting hay, consider the season and make plans with your hay contractor to optimise production and reduce spoilage.

Now is the time to also consider upgrading your bulls or rams to improve your genetics for muscle growth or confirmation. With the selling season starting late September, if you are looking at buying livestock, check your rural newspapers for advertisements. Ensure that sheep and cattle vaccinations are up to date before spring. Consult your private veterinarian for details.

Lyme Disease Association of Australia Department of Health (DoH) statement.

Response: The Department of Health, through the Chief Medical Officer, Professor Chris Baggoley, has taken an interest in Australian patients who are experiencing and sharing their stories of a chronic debilitating illness which some medical and health practitioners have ascribed to Lyme disease or a Lyme disease-like syndrome. Throughout the month of May, approximately 22,000 postcards were sent to MPs by their constituents to let them know that they are concerned about Lyme disease or Lyme-like illness and want them to do something about it. Several letters returned by MPs to constituents indicate that they have, indeed, taken an interest and have sought the advice of the Minister for Health about the issue. The Minister for Health and representatives on both sides of politics have replied with a standard letter that is illogical and largely dismissive of the very real epidemic affecting thousands of Australians. These letters provide no definitive timelines for the actions they propose and patients are left wondering how long they must wait for quality care; 'to-do lists' do not equate to action. Australian patients with a Lyme-like illness have been receiving the standard letter from both sides of politics for more than four years; patients are legitimately tired of the holding pattern response

Both the LDAA and the Lyme/Lyme-like disease community are incredibly grateful and view this as an important step in the fight for recognition!

on the same day? Change really is possible!!! Here's hoping.....

Put yourself over the Pits – What is the Fast Track Pit Stop?

A lot of blokes would appreciate the hard work and effort that goes into maintaining something we love. Whether it's a new car, a valued piece of machinery, or our weekend toys (boat, motorbike). If we don't service and look after our machines regularly it will eventually affect their performance and easy fix problems may be compounded, and will end up costing us time and money.

So why is this any different to our wellbeing and health? To put it simply if we neglect our wellbeing and health (whether it be physical, mental or social/spiritual) it will eventually catch up with us and could cost us more than just time and money. Do we think about the way this flows on to affect other facets of our lives, whether it be our relationships (family, work or business), loss of function or participation in the things we enjoy?

It is important to recognise that the ageing process throws up all sorts of changes and complications. Sometimes illness and diseases can't be avoided, however, something as simple as a "routine service visit" or discussion with your GP or treating health professional may assist in the early detection and prevention of certain health and wellbeing issues.

At RMHI we have a simple but effective program that aims to empower men and communities to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health. The Fast Track Pit Stop is related to the servicing of a vehicle and is a non-clinical, non-invasive way of helping men become more aware and take charge of their own health and wellbeing. It involves a 3 Point Health Awareness Check:

- ❖ **Waist Measurement/Chassis:** A waistline of more than 102cm (men) and 88cm (women) gives us an increased risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes, some cancers, stroke, heart disease and high blood pressure. Long term storage of internal fat surrounding the heart, liver, pancreas and kidneys is just one indicator.
- ❖ **Blood Pressure/Oil Pressure:** According to the Heart Foundation, high blood pressure is one of the main risk factors for heart disease, stroke and blood vessel disease. So it's important to firstly know your blood pressure, but also take steps to manage it if it's getting high.
- ❖ **Coping Skills/Shockies:** We are all affected by life's ups and downs, participants are given 10 questions to help identify stress levels. Encouraging communication and help seeking is part of the problem solving process.

We think it's about being there, allowing blokes to have a conversation, and listening. Life is hectic, people are busy, but it's about taking a minute to sit down, have a break and think about OUR health and wellbeing.

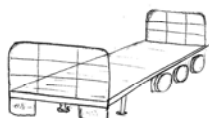

HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE (HACC)

Working together for a healthier country WA

About HACC

The HACC Service is part of the Beverley Health Service Multi Purpose Service (MPS), in which the Commonwealth funding for residential aged care, HACC and State health care funding have been combined with the aim of providing flexible health services to meet the health needs of the local community.

Who can access to Services

The HACC target population comprises of persons living in the community who, in the absence of basic maintenance and support services, are at risk of premature or inappropriate long-term residential care, including:

- (i) older and frail persons, with moderate, severe or profound disabilities;
- (ii) younger persons with moderate, severe or profound disabilities; and
- (iii) their carers.

HACC service provided

- ⇒ Meals on Wheels
- ⇒ Home Help
- ⇒ Home Maintenance
- ⇒ Personal Care Assistance: In- Home Respite care, Day Centre, Local Transport

For a fee schedule, please enquire at the Beverley Health Service Office 9646 3200.

HACC COORDINATOR

A new coordinator will be appointed in the next couple of months. In the meantime if you need assistance from HACC please direct your calls to Beverley Health Service Office 9646 3200.

TRANSPORT

When requesting transport to medical appointments please give the Health Service at least 7 working days notice. We will endeavor to assist you to get to your medical appointment providing we have a volunteer driver and vehicle available on the day. This is provided as a courtesy to the community and is not funded by HACC.

A reminder to clients who are transported that you (not the driver or the Health Service) are responsible for any parking fees.

ASSESSMENT

Assessment for HACC services is no longer conducted by a local Coordinator; instead this is now carried out by the Western Australian Assessment Framework's Regional Assessment Service (RAS).

If you have a general enquiry regarding aged care please phone My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 who will determine if you are seeking HACC support or Aged Care Assessment Team (ACAT) assessment.

Individuals or family members seeking community care can contact the Regional Assessment Service themselves (RAS) on 1300 785 415.

Callers will be asked a limited number of questions to determine whether an assessment should be conducted. HACC services Coordinator can also refer you to the Regional Assessment Service.

Once the need for assessment has been determined a RAS assessor will conduct a face to face interview in your home to ascertain the level of need and to plan appropriate support.

Following assessment, information will then be forwarded to the local HACC service provider who will implement the level of support recommended within available resources.

Current HACC clients will have a review by RAS annually or sooner if there is a need for changes to the current level of support.
