President Report

February 2016

Multipurpose Community and Visitor Hub – “Beverley Cornerstone”

Work preparing a submission to Round 3 of the highly competitive Federal National Stronger Regions grant programme continues, under a project title of “Beverley Cornerstone”. Addressing the application criteria, providing evidence of community and regional economic benefit, and seeking support, is a time consuming and multifaceted process. This important Beverley project enables a range of facilities and services to be provided from a co-located, contemporary and universally accessible central location. It will also be highly visible from the Highway/Hunt Road and provide an aesthetically pleasing entry to the town centre. I look forward to community engagement through the year regarding the Cornerstone project and other ideas and plans being investigated.

Register of Interest – BBP Aged Housing Project

The Beverley, Brookton & Pingelly (BBP) shires are currently working with the Wheatbelt Development Commission to develop a Business Plan for Aged Housing in our communities. Exact details for the project are yet to be determined. The Shire of Beverley proposes to establish a register of interested residents who wish to be placed on a waiting list for age appropriate housing in Beverley. No personal or financial information is required other than contact details at this time. Please contact the Shire Office as soon as possible to register.

2016/2017 Budget

Preparation for the 16/17 budget is underway. Various plans already inform the budget, such as the 10 year Financial Plan, 10 year Road Plan and Corporate Business Plan, however if there are specific issues you consider need addressing please contact the Shire Office to ensure Council has the opportunity to provide consideration of them, either in the forthcoming budget, or as current plans are reviewed. A review of the 10 year Financial Plan will occur in 2016.

Light Industrial Land

On the ground works to progress stage one of Beverley’s new light industrial land development in De Lisle St will finally be happening. This will be an amazing achievement following a “gob-smacking” drawn out process which has floundered for around 2 decades, causing immense frustration for Council over that time. There are still hurdles to enable completion of stages 2 and 3. Watch this space!

As mentioned in the January Blarney, Beverley is hosting one of several 4 day programmes of training opportunities for Elected Members. This will be held at the Recreation and Function Centre over the days of 25 & 26 February, and 31 March & 1 April 2016.

Beverley Frail Aged Lodge Committee – Meeting Monday 29th February 2016

Alex Miles Lodge is an important community facility owned by the community, overseen by the Beverley Frail Aged Lodge Committee, and managed by the WA Country Health Service. If you are interested in ensuring this facility remains in Beverley and have skills to offer the committee please give consideration toward attending the forthcoming meeting. 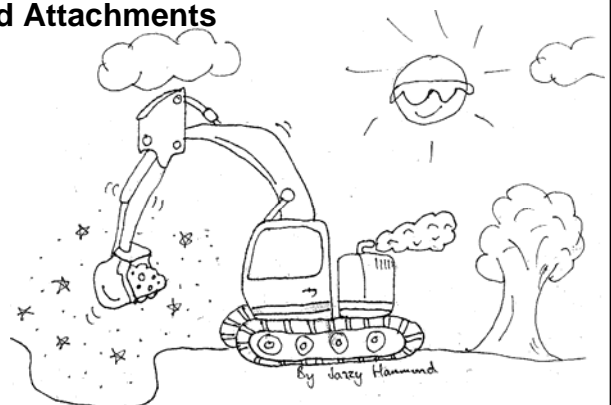

Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)

- ✓ Rinse your container immediately after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry



- ✓ Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing.

Oil-based chemicals (ULVs, LVs)



- ✓ Follow specific instructions on the product label or contact the manufacturer for further assistance

Other chemical residues



- ✓ Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry
- ✓ Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)



- ✓ A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

✓ **ELIGIBLE CONTAINERS WITH DIRT, RUST AND DYE STAINS ARE NOT CONSIDERED HAZARDOUS AND ARE THEREFORE ACCEPTED AT *drumMUSTER* COLLECTION CENTRES**

The CWA centre in Vincent Street was built in 1936 on the site donated by Mr. Frank McDonald (Snr). The cost of the building was raised by local members. This building has served as "home" to many local organisations, social groups and used by country members as a base in town.

Inter-branch functions have always been a great means of fostering friendships and interests from other groups with similar interests.

DID YOU ALSO KNOW that the CWA has raised many issues which are relevant to country people and through their highly respected voice to State Government have been instrumental in achieving a host of improvements, regulations and services state wide.

Warriors Wellbeing

What do you do when someone close to you is struggling but won't seek help?

I was speaking with a bloke not long ago, "Joe", who was feeling really frustrated trying to help a mate who was more or less avoiding his attempts at support and refusing to seek help, even though he was obviously in some emotional distress. As is often the case Joe felt powerless in this situation and asked how he might better approach things.

So what do we do when someone close to us, often a friend or family member won't seek help? How do we manage the sense of obligation we may feel or the emotions that come with this?

It's important firstly to try and understand the reasons why some people are less likely to seek help when it is needed. We need to recognise that often when people are in the middle of a tough situation simply making a decision to admit something is wrong can be a difficult and daunting thing. It can take time for some people to become comfortable enough with their situation to then contemplate the idea of accessing help. For others, negotiating feelings of embarrassment and shame can be quite overwhelming.

I take my hat off to Joe because, like him, we all need to recognise our role as primary carers, that is, everyday people in the community actively supporting and looking out for our mates.

Whilst our intentions can be coming from a good place, trying to force someone to change or get help could actually put more of a strain on your relationship. Alternatively, simply avoiding them can foster stronger feelings of isolation and possibly result in the person becoming even more resistant. This can prove difficult when the time comes and they are ready to reach out but may no longer feel comfortable with the idea of approaching you.

As difficult as these situations can seem, it is really important to be there for people who are going through a tough time. You can do this just by letting them know you are available to listen when they need it and help when they do decide to reach out. In the meantime you could take the opportunity to do a bit of research into what specialised local support options might be available, if required, such as a counsellor, financial/legal support or the GP, so you can be prepared and direct them when they do reach out. We also need to remind ourselves that the ability to “listen effectively” is one of the most important skills we can possess. Being a good listener can have a big impact on improving our relationships and helping others.

At the end of the day it's also important to look after yourself! Setting clear boundaries is healthy and is all about understanding our limits. If you are starting to feel overwhelmed, talking to someone yourself can provide a good outlet and perhaps some insights into ways to manage the situation.

Most of the time, giving someone the space they need to arrive at seeking help is a good thing. However, if you do have concerns that someone is at imminent risk or danger to themselves or others due to their situation, then it is important that you act on this and seek professional help immediately. In these circumstances you may be worried about going against a person's wishes, but in reality I think most of us would rather deal with an angry response than a situation where the person we care about is seriously hurt or in trouble.

Windows 10 - Should I upgrade?

The simple answer is "YES", but upgrading is not as simple as it seems. There are many traps for the inexperienced PC user. This article helps you consider when and how to upgrade. A helpful magazine "The Definitive Guide to Windows 10" is available from the Beverley Newsagency.

Why Windows 10?

Windows 8 was a major disaster. It was so different from earlier Windows that most users freaked and Corporates refused to upgrade. So Microsoft cancelled Windows 9 and aligned Windows 10 with Windows 7. Microsoft also decided that they would no longer develop new operating systems (e.g. Vista;7;8) but will continuously upgrade Windows 10.

So you will have to move to Windows 10 sometime, sooner is better! Windows 10 will be familiar to Windows 7 and earlier users but incorporates features from Windows 8 that allow it to be shared across PCs, tablets and phones.

Upgrade from Windows 7 and 8

Microsoft offer a free upgrade from Windows 7 and 8 until **29 July 2016, so upgrade before then.** However there are hidden costs. First you must install all Windows 7 or 8 updates; (up to 1.5 Gigabytes [GB]). Then download Windows 10 (3GB) and possibly Office 2016 (1.5GB). Up to 6GB! This may be more than your monthly Internet allowance, time-consuming and costly, particularly in country areas where you can't access ADSL or NBN.

When upgrading you don't lose any files, but you have to configure Windows 10. By default it is designed for the modern all-communicating world and will constantly be connecting over the Internet: downloading updates, news, weather and adverts, sharing information with friends; your location; your advertising preferences, etc. These can be turned off but it takes time, effort and knowledge.

Security Tip

If you don't have an external back-up hard drive – do yourself a favour and go and buy one as soon as possible.

A 1 Terabyte drive will cost about \$90 online or in a store.

Regular backups on an external drive are the only way to guarantee not losing your files if something goes wrong.

Upgrade from Windows XP and Vista

There is no upgrade from Windows XP or Vista to Windows 10. You have to upgrade your PC hardware, buy Windows 10, save your files and completely rebuild the PC. Performance will likely be poor. A low end new PC will probably be more powerful than the old XP or Vista PC.

PCs have a useful life of about 5 years. XP PCs are usually more than 9 years old, and Vista PCs more than 6 years old. **It is easier and probably cheaper to scrap the old PC and buy a new Windows 10 PC.**

Windows XP Support

XP support ended April 2014. If criminals find a way to get into an XP PC and do harm, the holes will not be patched by updates, leaving XPs wide open to virus attacks. **Windows XP is a security liability. My strong recommendation is: scrap the XP PC as soon as possible, and buy a new PC with Windows 10 already installed.**

Windows Vista Support

Vista is still supported by Microsoft, so you can safely continue to use Vista until support ends, which is soon. Then my advice will be as for XP above.

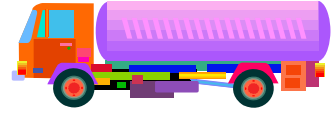

Formal business meetings

It is also our recommendation, based upon the experience that we have in these matters, that formal and regular structured meetings should occur amongst the members of the Business who have an interest, either direct or indirect, in the Business to ensure that the core values, goals and philosophy of the Business are maintained, any risk to the Business is minimised and any misunderstandings between members of the Business addressed at an early stage. For example, we recommend that regular and formal business meetings occur no less than once every quarter and be supported by an agenda, minutes of previous meetings and notices of any resolutions that will be moved at the next meeting. Those documents should be circulated amongst all the members of the Business and notice thereof given within a reasonable time prior to the meeting (which we considered to be not less than seven days before the meeting) so as to give each attendant the opportunity to properly prepare for the meeting.

A formal meeting structure is of particular benefit to those who are "off farm" and not privy to the day to day discussions and decisions which are made and which impact upon the direction, profit and success of the Business.

Strategic plan

As part of the suite of documents we recommend be prepared by the members of a farming business, a strategic plan is very important.

The strategic plan should be for a period of not less than three years and probably not more than five years and must interface seamlessly with the constitution and the expectations of the members of the Business.

Annual retreats

From our experience and from discussions with clients, we recommend that annually the strategic plan and the progress of the Business be reviewed by a meeting of all members of the Business whether they be "on farm" or "off farm" and that the review occur away from the Business so as to give each attendant the opportunity to fully focus on the review. We recommend the review last not more than one day and not less one half day.

Role of the advisors

The task of completing a business constitution and strategic plan is somewhat daunting and can be made more simple by the use of your trusted advisors and banker. To that end, we recommend that during the process, and sooner rather than later, you involve your banker, your accountant, your farm advisor and your lawyer to assist in the completion of the process. The combined knowledge and experience of the members of the Business and their advisors will have a substantial impact upon the quality and longevity of a successful business.

Checklist

There are many other matters that should be included in the constitution and strategic plan of a business. It is our recommendation that a checklist of those matters be prepared before holding the meetings necessary to prepare those documents. We have prepared a checklist of those matters and are more than willing to make our checklist available to you upon request.

Artist-in-Residence

Christine is a botanical and wildlife artist from country Queensland. She is one of the founding members of the Botanical Artists Society of Queensland and is happy to hold classes in botanical art or eco printing. What is eco printing? Sometimes known as eco dyeing, it is the contemporary application of the traditions of natural dyeing. Plants are enclosed in textiles or paper, bundled by winding over rods or stacked in layers and then steamed or immersed in hot water to extract the pigments and produce a print made with plant dyes. Of course there are plants that are poisonous and not recommended to use. To learn more about this fascinating art of eco printing or botanical drawing, drop into the Station and check with Chrissie for workshop dates during second half of February or ring Marylou Hutchinson.

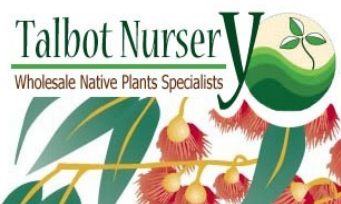

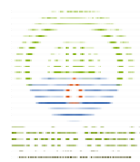

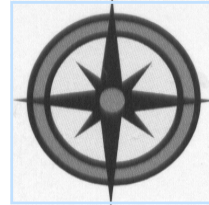

Lyme Disease Association of Australia

[Senate Community Affairs Inquiry 2016](#)

Growing evidence of an emerging tick-borne disease that causes a Lyme like illness for many Australian patients. On 12 November 2015, the Senate referred the following matter to the Senate Community Affairs References Committee for inquiry and report:

Have your say, tell your story

The committee want to:

1. find out how many people have a Lyme-like illness and where they live;
2. find out how to protect patients, doctors and researchers from poor treatment;
3. understand how people get diagnosed with Lyme-like illness. They want to know about pathology laboratories, the types of tests in use and how they work. They want to know how laboratories, and people, can make sure they are doing the right tests the right way. They are interested in overseas tests and if they are different, why? They want to know why tests done overseas are not accepted in Australia;
4. find out how much money was spent on research. They want to know what research is looking at the germs and bugs that people get from ticks. They want to know what research is looking at other ways people can become sick with Lyme-like illness;
5. find out if there is research looking for a unique Australian bug/s that is causing many people to have a Lyme-like illness;
6. find out what types of signs and symptoms people have when they have Lyme-like illness. They want to know how those people are being treated and how patients and families are impacted by their illness; and If there is anything else they need to know, You can find the [full terms of reference](#) on the Senate website.

It's important that everyone who has a Lyme-like illness, and their friends and family make a submission telling the Senate committee about their story. This is your opportunity to stand up and be counted. You don't need to answer all the points, you can simply tell your own story about how you became sick and how you've been treated. You can provide your opinion on any of the other points too. The committee are especially interested in hearing from people with a lived experience of Lyme-like illness.

This is really important for anyone you know who may fall into this category. There is a template available on the Lyme Disease Associations web site, which is easy to follow & helpful to fill. It can be a family member filling in, if the person is too ill to be able to do it.

All submissions will be accepted by the Association and forwarded to the Senate inquiry where Members of the Association will be present in person to present all the submissions.

This is our chance to be heard and we need a very loud voice so please anyone you know who is suffering, to participate.

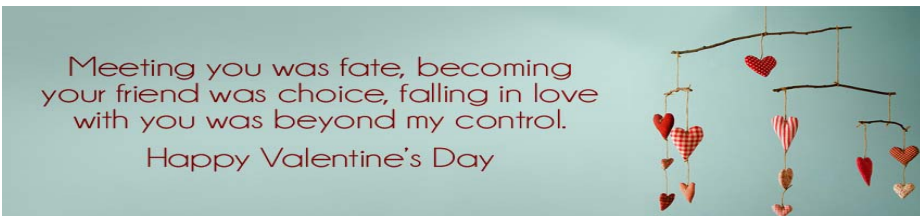
