SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - APRIL 2017



Avondale Survey – please provide your feedback

Most people in the community would have received a survey in the mail recently seeking feedback and comments on Avondale. This information will assist the National Trust WA and Shire of Beverley to review and prioritise recommendations of the Avondale Masterplan and best focus development of the place. It may also provide information for the volunteer Avondale Farm Project Association to refine their role in support of Avondale. The survey is available online via the National Trust WA website (nationaltrust.org.au/initiatives/avondale-priorities) or via the Shire of Beverley website (beverley.wa.gov.au) and additional copies are at the Shire office and CRC. The survey will continue until after Easter.

Paddock Burning

REMINDER - Shire of Beverley Firebreak Order – paddock burns at any time throughout the year (including now in preparation for seeding) are **required to have a firebreak 2.2m wide** clear of all inflammable material completely surrounding the area to be burnt and an operational fire-fighting unit having a capacity of not less than 650Lt. Please ensure you are aware of the Fire-Break Order and follow its guidelines.

Cr Brown

Council's thoughts have been with Cr Brown and best wishes offered for a speedy recovery following injuries sustained in a serious assault. Police investigations into the incident are continuing.

York Williams Bridge Replacement

The bridge at the Brookton boundary on York Williams Rd (near Valentine Rd) is being replaced with a new 7 barrel culvert. The old bridge has been removed and a detour track installed. Wet weather has caused delays to the project.

Road Re-seals and New Bitumen

Road reseals have been undertaken by contractors on 7.4km of the York Williams Rd and two sections of the Westdale Rd. Work on these roads is part funded through the State Regional Road Group allocations. New bitumen has been laid in the town boundary on gravel sections of Railway, Grigson, Bartram, Barnsley and Queen streets.

WANDRRA Claim

Various roads and associated infrastructure in the Shire have been assessed for damage following the February emergency weather event. Cost estimates are being established for reinstatement with the aim of seeking WANDRRA (Western Australian Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements) assistance to undertake the works.

Shire Refuse Site

Graeme Tuddenham is contracted to manage the refuse site for the Shire and undertakes this task professionally and with care. Following the Department of Environment's most recent inspection (which occur annually), the Shire received a letter outlining the Refuse Site meets the requirements as set out in the licence. Thank you and congratulations are extended to Graeme for his diligence and a job well done. Unfortunately some vandalism and break-in's have been occurring at the refuse site which is being investigated, as is the installation of security cameras. Any information you may have about others less respectful of this facility would be welcomed by the Shire. On another note, works have commenced on the long awaited upgrade of Nicholas Street (road leading to the refuse site).

Beverley Triathlon 2017

Congratulations to the dynamic Triathlon Committee, Beverley CRC, many volunteer helpers and to everyone who participated. What a fantastic event and another great day in Beverley!

Swimming Club Facilities Upgrade

Hon Christian Porter MP visited Beverley in March to compete in the 2017 Beverley Triathlon and unveil the Beverley Swimming Club Rooms upgrade, which was funded through a Federal Building our Future Community Development Grant for \$23,000. Congratulations to the Beverley Swimming Club on receiving these funds and for having the work completed in time for the 2017 Triathlon.

AVONDALE Priorities



Adapt buildings for new uses

The homestead could be adapted to allow limited cafe operation during special events. Further adaptation to the homestead to improve access, interpretation and education should be considered.

The Landcare Resource Centre building could be upgraded for community uses and as lecture/ meeting rooms for the community and tour groups.



Conserve and interpret historic buildings

The homestead, silo, garage, blacksmith shop, killing shed, weighbridge etc. are in need of conservation with interpretation for education and tourism benefits.



Develop commercial ventures

The aquaculture ponds for example could be redeveloped as a commercial venture with tourism benefits.

Facilities for school groups, corporates or other teams could be developed on site. The Master plan identifies this as low priority and unlikely to be commercially viable.



Caravan park and camping ground

Serviced caravan and camping facilities are not considered economically viable and may poach custom from Shire facility. Casual caravan parking and camping could be acceptable for events.



Maintain buildings for operational use

The former seed grading shed, shearing shed, header and hay sheds should be continued for operational farm use as required and for educational/ tourism benefits where appropriate.

Upgrade vacant buildings

Funding has been received for conservation and renovation of the houses for short or medium term accommodation to provide an income stream. This project is underway.



Conserve remnant bushland

The 52 hectare bush reserve is recognised as significant for its high degree of biodiversity, priority flora and range of unusual species. Weed control, revegetation, fire management and feral animal control is ongoing.



Maintain active farming

Arable land is leased to the adjacent land owner who continues a long tradition of farming which started with the establishment of the state's first agricultural research station in 1924.



Support volunteers

The Avondale Farm Project Association (AFPA) is a community body representing a wide range of persons interested in, and supportive of, Avondale.



Improve public facilities

The picnic area has been upgraded. More work is required to improve public access, roads, carparks, paths, toilets and playground. Wayfinding signage is not specifically identified in the master plan but is also important.



Conserve and interpret historic buildings

The historic stables building has a new roof and other urgent works have been completed. It should be retained as stables and additional interpretation, education and tourism opportunities explored as a major drawcard. Work should continue with the Clydesdale Horse Association.



Continue a program of special events

Special events such as a Harvest Festival and Clydesdale Ploughing Day are a major tourism drawcard, community focus and educational vehicle. They can provide an important income stream and should be co-ordinated with other local and regional events for community cross-benefit.



Develop trails

Development of trails in conjunction with the bush reserve and green links suitable for recreational use (walking, cycling) in appropriate areas will increase educational value and visitation.



Develop and implement interpretation

High quality interpretation is the key to enhancing visitors' enjoyment and understanding of the place. The interpretation plan should be developed and works implemented to improve visitor experience and appreciation of the site and its natural, Aboriginal and historic heritage values.



Promote Aboriginal cultural heritage values and business opportunities

Engage the Aboriginal community in activities at Avondale, and create opportunities for enhanced educational and tourism programs based on Aboriginal cultural knowledge for the social and economic benefit of all stakeholders.

Develop small scale, self-funding Aboriginal business opportunities with training components utilising resources at Avondale.



Improve the museum display

The museum collection is owned by the Shire of Beverley and operated by volunteers who continue to work on cataloguing and conserving the collection as well as keeping the place open to the public.

A major restructure of the Farm Machinery Museum exhibition would improve presentation. A storage shed and workshop is needed to conserve machinery and facilitate volunteer activity.



Develop training programs

Training programs have been used to complete conservation of the stables building and could potentially be used for future conservation and other building projects.

Training programs could also be developed for flora and fauna management, including an on-site nursery. A nursery may provide a modest income stream from sale of plants.

Programs could also be developed for farm and land management, tourism, volunteer training and upskilling etc.

Establish a public access control point

Overall site management and safety is needed and a point to facilitate income collection from visitation.



Develop education programs

Develop education programs around contemporary farming, farming history with reference to collections of buildings and settings. The machinery museum, the natural environment and its integration with the farm, Aboriginal heritage and culture.

Educational programs will increase visitation/income and the overall value of Avondale to the broader community.

Beverley Swimming clubrooms get a makeover

- New infrastructure allows the club to train under race conditions and increase learn-to-swim programmes.
- Beverley Triathlon marks official opening of upgraded facilities.
- Upgrade made possible thanks to a \$23,000 investment by the Coalition Government

The Beverley sporting community have today begun using the new-look swimming pool clubrooms and race equipment with the official opening of the upgraded facility.

Minister for Regional Development Fiona Nash said more than 5000 people attending the pool each year will benefit from improved facilities and equipment, including the regions aspiring athletes.

"Junior members and volunteers will also benefit from the upgrade as the new race equipment will enable training sessions to take place under competitive race conditions," Minister Nash said.

Federal Member for Pearce Christian Porter attended the Beverley triathlon today and said the club will benefit from new infrastructure including a pace clock and race starter.

"Having a memorabilia cabinet in the swimming pool clubrooms will inspire younger swimmers by having a permanent display of awards and achievements of the club," Mr Porter said.

"The upgraded facilities will increase swimming memberships and promote learn-to-swim programmes the whole community can benefit from."

The Coalition Government invested \$23,000 through the Community Development Grants programme funding with contributions from Beverley Swimming Club.

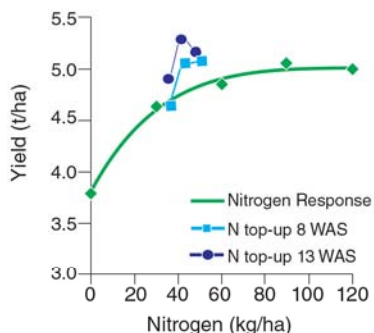

The Queen's Baton Relay wants you!

Western Australia welcomes the Queen's Baton Relay in lead up to Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games

Western Australia is looking for local legends to carry the Queen's Baton in Western Australia as part of the Queen's Baton Relay (QBR) in the lead up to the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018).

The Baton will arrive in Western Australia on Thursday 22 February 2018 and will spend six days travelling through 19 communities, highlighting the State's great diversity.

Thousands of people are expected to turn out to cheer the batonbearers on.

Local legends will carry the Queen's Baton from Albany, the departure point for WWI soldiers, north through areas including Manjimup, Bridgetown and Bunbury. After spending time in the metro area, showcasing our iconic coastline and meeting the odd quokka, the Baton will head north to Karratha for its last day on Tuesday 27 February 2018.

"A relay isn't a relay without people, so the Queen's Baton Relay is looking for people of all ages and abilities to run the Baton around our State," says Ron Alexander, Director General of the Department of Sport and Recreation.

"This is your chance to be part of one of the country's biggest community events – and you don't need to be an athlete to be nominated.

"We want people who represent all that's great about our communities: someone who has made a significant contribution to sport, education, the arts, culture, community or a charity.

Mr Alexander said the Relay was a chance to show off the best of Western Australia to the rest of the Commonwealth – from our oceans to the amazing outdoors, places of Aboriginal significance and proud communities which are part of who we are.

"The Baton's journey will also inspire community pride and build excitement for the largest event to be staged in Australia in a decade.

"On a bigger playing field, this is a chance for Australia to inspire and welcome the world: exploring and celebrating the links, traditions and people that connect Australian communities with the Commonwealth."

From today until 15 May 2017, anyone can nominate a person who inspires them to be great. Nominations can be made at gc2018.com/qbr.

GC2018 are looking for Australian citizens or people lawfully entitled to reside in Australia during the Relay period (25 December 2017 – 4 April 2018) and one of the following:

- Have achieved something extraordinary or inspired others to achieve something extraordinary.
- Have made a significant contribution to sport, education, the arts, culture, charity or within their community.
- Have excelled or aspire to excel athletically or personally.
- Contribute to a fun, friendly, vibrant and inclusive community.
- Are at least 10 years old as at 25 December 2017.

Across Australia approximately 3,800 batonbearers are needed to share the dream of the friendly Games.

The Queen's Baton will travel through Australia for 100 days from 25 December 2017.

The Queen's message is held in the Baton and will be read aloud at the Opening Ceremony on 4 April 2018 to officially open the Games on the Gold Coast.

The Queen's Baton Relay will pass through Albany, Denmark, Manjimup, Bridgetown, Bunbury, Rockingham, Rottneest, Fremantle, South Perth, Burswood Park, Perth, King's Park, City Beach, Scarborough, Hillarys, Quinns Rock, Wanneroo, Guildford and Karratha.

Community Information

The State Governments' Local Government Reform Programme seeks to create a process of continuous improvement across the sector with Councils required to develop Integrated Planning and Reporting Frameworks including plans such as the Strategic Community Plan, Corporate Business Plan, Long Term Financial Plan and Asset Management Plans (plus others).

In 2012 our rate payers and electors gave Council a very clear mandate there was limited support toward continuing with the South East Avon Regional Transition Group and potentially amalgamation. It was clear that amalgamation was not a preferred option at all for our community. Although it is unknown if Local Government will be the focus of forced amalgamations in the future, there are some who believe this will be the case.

Improving sustainability, addressing efficiencies, regional collaboration, and fostering economic development in the district, will place the Shire in a stronger position to argue against amalgamation. The Department of Local Government has developed a series of financial ratios, which when applied determine if the Local Government is or has the potential to become sustainable with appropriate planning over the long term.

Asset Management Plans have been an eye opener with the annual funding shortfall for asset management, renewal and replacement challenging. This has encouraged many Local Governments to rationalise and consolidate the infrastructure they are responsible for, removing it from their Asset Registers altogether. Renewal costs, including expenditure to conform to current building and universal access standards for public buildings requires evaluation against potential use of the space, social benefit gained and associated cost to the ratepayer.

This was the basis of Councils decision not to expend any more funds on the Infant Health Building and initiate its removal, whilst also seeking community support and external funding for the Cornerstone multipurpose facility to service the needs of the community into the future and contribute to the economic growth and development of the district. Proposals need to be considered in terms of capital cost, social benefit, economic return and whole of life costs including operational, maintenance and replacement costs.

Beverley's 10 Year Financial Plan includes a proposed 6% annual rate increase which facilitates an improvement in our financial ratios. The actual rate each year is determined as the budget is developed and it is Councils' decision to set the rate depending on the community's needs and expectations based on the Integrated Planning process. In 15/16 this increase was 4 % and the 16/17 budget 3%. It is Councils intention to continue a conservative budgetary process.

Give Credit Where Credit Is Due – What are your expectations?

Last week my 8 year old son participated in his first school swimming carnival, and ended up winning his first ever medal for “champion boy” in his age. Unfortunately I was away on a work trip, and of course when I spoke to the family that evening my son was the first on the end of the phone to tell me proudly of his achievement (he doubted himself and never expected to win). This recognition for effort has been amazing for his confidence and I have even noticed a positive change in his motivation towards other extra-curricular activities that had previously challenged his confidence.

A field known as “positive psychology” (focusing on one’s strengths) has come up with findings that this aids in increasing wisdom, satisfaction and a sense of purpose. It’s common sense really, how good do we feel when someone tells us we have done a good job?

There are three main areas where we can have a direct influence and use some “positive psychology” that is; in our family lives, in and around our working lives, in our community groups (sport clubs, rotary/men’s shed, church groups).

To do this effectively we have to always maintain our own good mental health and wellbeing and a definition which encapsulates this is summarised by the World Health Organisation (2007) - “a state of wellbeing in which an individual realises his or her own abilities, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and is able to make a contribution to his or her community”.

The interesting thing is that it’s almost a social and personal expectation to continually commit ourselves to our family, working, and community lives, and rightly so. These are all important areas and putting time and effort in gives us satisfaction.

Getting the balance right however between these three commitments, is tough, especially when “expectations” are not understood. In the work we do we come across a lot of misunderstanding and distress caused by individuals not communicating what their expectations are. For example a husband and wife discussing personal vs relationship expectations, a parent and teenager discussing boundaries, a boss and staff member discussing working conditions/priorities, and/or a footy coach discussing positions/roles within his team.

High expectations can be positive, it can help us grow as individuals and/or as a collective, reach achievements and hit our goals. However, many of us can also take this too far. We can easily become cynical of ourselves and others, especially when it comes to making mistakes. Shaming and blaming doesn’t help! Look for the strengths in others and yourself and don’t forget to give credit where credit is due.

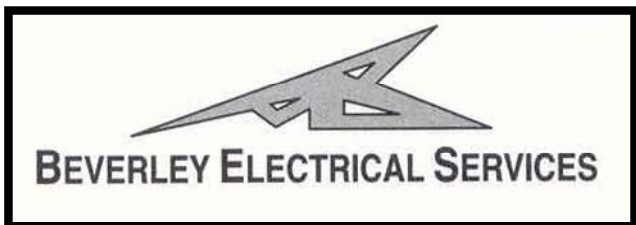

I Always Wanted To Fly: My 1st 8 months

I always wanted to fly but jumping off a wall with a red cloak didn't really generate the excitement that I was searching for and flying a motorised aircraft was beyond the war office's budget and she refused to get a second job. Flying gliders for some unknown reason was absent from my cognitive schema until not so long ago whilst searching for a hot air ballooning experience I noticed a glider promotion – a distinct possibility.

It was a few months later I made that all important phone call to the Gliderman, he was convincing. Come up on Saturday, have a look around, give it a go and so I did. I can distinctly remember the drive to Beverley with plenty of time to think about a sport that I knew absolutely zip about.

I arrived at Beverley airstrip early on Friday 22nd April and was met cautiously by the googlie eyed Curlew. Shortly after I met Bob who introduced me to the Gliderman who gave me the grand tour of every nook and cranny of the Beverley Soaring Society site before he introduced me to Ross for my first flight. I was absolutely hooked. So the 14 instructors that I have tortured for the past 8 months you can blame the Gliderman and Ross doing a really good job of getting me hooked.

Eight months have flown by and on reflection I am blown away by comradery and support that members share with each other.

This positive club culture doesn't happen by accident. It is clearly evident that many people over many years, in a variety of roles have contributed to ensure the club is welcoming, well run, inclusive, in a strong position and runs smoothly in an enjoyable and safe environment. It is rare to find a club of this size that consistently maintains such a strong culture.

I have really enjoyed my learning journey over the past 8 months, it has been intense, challenging at times and a steep learning curve. I'm a tad surprised at how much I have learned and the opportunities provided to me by the army of volunteers that have given up their time so generously

I take my hat off to the great work that the instructors do. They all have their own unique instructional style and they work with trainee pilots that have different learning styles. What impressed me most is that the key messages that they deliver are the same, particularly safety. I did at times ponder if I would have been better off with one or two instructors, but the number of times a different approach, the timing of a prompt, the variation in an explanation, a simple diagram drawn in the dirt or a detailed debriefing, often triggered the penny

to drop with a particular concept or skill.

There are 2 types of trainees at Beverley Soaring Society - the young'uns that appear to neuro map their fine and gross motor skills with ease and have decades of flying ahead of them. The ubiquitous group that choose to dye their hair grey and require assistance to get in and out of a cockpit and are attempting to catch up on the 30 years of flying. I fit into the latter group, hence my progress is commensurate with my age. Having said that, I have made a number of sustained periods of progress which I am thrilled about.

This progress generally lapses into a consolidating plateau – and that's ok, nothing wrong with a bit of consolidation. And then... just when you think you are nailing it, one of those really frustrating days comes along. My motor skills and logic are holidaying in Perth whilst my body attempts to fly a glider at Beverley – nothing goes the way you want it to. If you were my instructor on one of those few days I apologise. I could feel your positive intent willing me on to get it right but frustratingly it was not happening. So don't knock yourself out, that's the crappy part of the learning curve. For me, even on those frustrating days I always learned valuable lessons.

Over the decades I have participated in many sports and had many adventures but going solo is right up there at the top. I know this simply signifies the start of my never ending learning journey but it was a very memorable experience on a number of levels. It was made even better by those people that assisted me and had the confidence to let me go solo on that day. For me, a very proud moment.

I'm very happy to be a member of the Beverley Soaring Society.

Creepy crawlies here to stay

Rain and warm weather stimulates Portuguese millipede activity as they escape the wet, water-soaked soil in search of a mate and drier ground. It's this search, their attraction to light, and their extraordinary numbers that make them a nuisance to householders and businesses alike. The ultimate uninvited house-guest.

Native to southwest Europe, Portuguese millipedes (*Ommatoiulus moreletii*) arrived in South Australia (SA) in 1953 and despite eradication attempts and extensive research; there remains no practical solution for their total control or eradication from the environment.

When first discovered in Roleystone, Western Australia (WA) in 1986, they were already well established. Now, they're a widespread and common nuisance pest throughout south-west WA and are present in the ACT, NSW, VIC, TAS and SA.

Typically, the outbreaks we encounter are short-lived and associated with autumn and spring rains, and are much less frequently encountered in the cold of winter or the heat of summer.

Most prolific in the first few years after their introduction to a new area, the population will peak in the first few years before declining with time. This is likely due to a parasitic nematode, naturally present in native nematode populations, providing biological control.

Management

When millipede populations are high, employ two or more control methods (cultural, physical, chemical or biological) to reduce their impact and entry into buildings.

Turning off unnecessary outdoor lighting and setting millipede light

traps away from the building can reduce their attraction to your home. Placing door seals/dust strips can help prevent their entry. Insecticide barrier sprays around the home and base of walls will also help reduce their numbers and their movement up walls and drain pipes.

Internet Scams

In the March 2015 Blarney I explained about computer viruses. With Windows 10 and good security, viruses are not such an issue as they used to be. Now criminals are focussing more on scams to make money illegitimately. About \$7m was lost in Australia to scammers in Feb 2017 alone!!! Email is the biggest vulnerability.

Types of Scams

Go to the government **Scamwatch** site for good information, <https://www.scamwatch.gov.au/types-of-scams>. Scams play on emotional/financial triggers. The criminals are very adept at convincing you they are genuine and may even have personal information from online sources.

Unexpected Money or Winnings: These scams offer to send you money or say you have won a prize and ask for your bank account details. Don't - They will clear your bank accounts.

Fake charities or directories: Scammers tell you they from a charity or sell you adverts in non-existent magazine or directory. The money goes in the scammer's pocket

Dating and Romance: Scammers take advantage of people looking for partners, via dating websites, apps or social media by pretending to be companions. They use emotional triggers to get you to provide money, gifts or personal details.

Buying and selling: There are many different ways that scammers convince you to buy something that doesn't exist or you don't want, or at inflated prices.

Jobs and investment: Scammers entice you to enter into "get rich quick" schemes or "foolproof" betting schemes or offer high paying jobs for a fee. Only the scammer gets rich!

Vista support ends April 11 2017

XP support ended in April 2014. If criminals find a way to hack into a Vista or XP PC and do harm, the holes will not be patched by updates, leaving PCs wide open to virus attacks. **Windows XP and Vista are a security liability. My strong recommendation is: scrap a Vista or XP PC as soon as possible, and buy a new Windows 10 PC.** Most Vista and XP PCs can't be updated to Windows 10 Windows 7 support continues until January 2020.

Obtaining personal Information: Phishers trick you into entering your computer or giving them personal information e.g. bank account/credit card numbers and passwords Hackers do the same by breaking into your computer.

Malware & ransomware: Malware tricks you into installing software that allows scammers to access your files and track what you are doing, while ransomware demands payment to 'unlock' your computer or files.

Remote access scams: Scammers try to convince you that you have a computer or internet problem and that you need to buy new software to fix the problem.

Avoiding Scams

Check email and internet addresses carefully (especially links in email or web pages). If they look suspicious delete the email or don't click on the link. It is better to be safe than sorry. If in doubt check on the Internet – enter in your search engine "the name" + "scam", e.g. "Nigerian letter scam"

April sees increased traffic on our roads during the school holidays and Easter period.

Targeting unsafe road-user behaviour is one of the key priorities for WA Police and plays an essential role in minimising the number of people killed and seriously injured on our roads. WA police will continue to maximise efforts to reduce injury on our roads and ensure road users are protected from unlawful and antisocial road behaviour.

We will enforce traffic laws, target unsafe road user behaviour and build road policing capacity through partnerships and community engagement. There will be zero tolerance to mobile phone and restraint offences, and traffic powers will be utilised to keep recidivist traffic offenders off the roads. Targeting unsafe road-user behaviour is one of the key priorities for WA Police and plays an essential role in minimising the number of people killed and seriously injured on our roads.

Towards Zero is the State's Road Safety Strategy and is underpinned by the safe system approach and aims to improve road safety through four cornerstones:-

- Safe road use – Compliant, alert* and safety conscious road users play a vital role in preventing crashes
- Safe roads and roadsides
- Safe speeds
- Safe vehicles

* Driver Reviver is an initiative that aims to reduce fatigue related crashes by encouraging travellers to take regular breaks in their journey by visiting an operating site (these sites run predominantly during peak periods such as Easter and Christmas).

Facts about Fatigue

- There are many causes of fatigue, with driving for a long period of time seen as one of the key causes to fatigue related road trauma.

- There is a higher fatigue risk when driving at night time and on rural roads. The WA 10 Year Crash Statistics report showed that fatigue was a factor in more than double serious crashes on rural WA roads between midnight and 6.00am
- The reaction time of a driver who has been awake for 17-19 hours is similar to the reaction time of a driver with a blood alcohol concentrations (BAC) of 0.05
- Not sleeping for 20-25 hours will reduce a drivers reaction time to the equivalent reaction time of someone with a BAC of 0.10
- Shift workers are six times more likely to be involved in a fatigue related road crash than other workers. Research shows that there are three times as many fatal accidents at work during the night shift (11pm – 7am) as during the day.

So please ensure you are well rested before driving for a long period and take adequate rest breaks along the way.

DID YOU KNOW?

I have been asked for clarification about last months “Did You Know” in relation to the use of mobile phones while driving/moving, in particular, parked versus being stationary:-

The penalty for the driver of a motor vehicle using a mobile phone while moving *or stationary* but not *parked* is **\$400** and **3 demerit points**.

If you have moved off the road or into a parking bay and your vehicle is **stationary** (completely stopped) then it is considered you have attempted to comply.

Lyme Disease News

Lyme Disease Association of Australia (LDAA) was awarded a \$35,000 grant from Country Women's Association (CWA) NSW in 2016 to put towards research into tick borne illness in Australia. After considerable analysis of a variety of research proposals it was determined that the progress, method and credibility of the Murdoch University (MU) team made them a standout candidate. The Lyme Disease Association of Australia (LDAA) in conjunction with the [Country Women's Association \(CWA\) of NSW](#) are proud to announce funding for a new study into tick-borne illness.

Professors Peter Irwin and Una Ryan, co-directors of the VWBPG, said intense public and government concern about the potential for tick-borne disease in Australia has led to a now urgent need for new research using cutting edge, advanced DNA technology in order to properly inform the debate.

"Over the last 30 years recognition of a 'Lyme-like' syndrome has emerged, the onset of which has been attributed to people bitten by native Australian ticks," Professor Irwin said. "There have been manifestations of an undiagnosed illness causing significant patient distress, with symptoms presenting in a similar fashion to tick-borne diseases overseas."

The LDAA are so proud to have contributed to this and want to thank all the ladies at the CWA of NSW for their amazing voluntary work for Lyme patients in Australia. Thank you so much CWA!

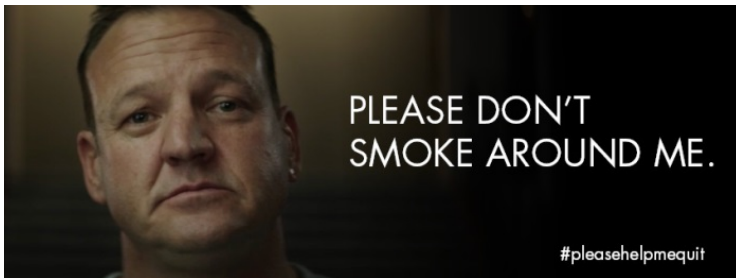
When we asked smokers what was the main reason their quit attempts had failed, the most common answer by far was friends and family smoking around them.

Last month Make Smoking History (MSH) launched the **brand new WA-made campaign 'From Every Quitter'**. The campaign features a diverse group of twelve Western Australians who have recently quit smoking or are currently attempting to quit. In the television advertisement each person delivers an authentic heartfelt plea directly to camera, asking smokers, "If you can't quit with me, don't smoke around me."

'Seeing other people smoke' was uncovered as a key trigger to light up by smokers involved in focus group research that was commissioned by Make Smoking History in November 2015. The same study, found that having loved ones who smoke was the number one barrier to quitting smoking for both males and females. This campaign aims to help people on their quitting journey by rallying the support of their friends and family, especially those who continue to smoke. It will run throughout WA until Saturday 6 May 2017.

Research shows that 2 out of 3 long term smokers will die from their cigarette addiction, ie of the 257,000 adults in WA who smoke, 171,000 will die due to their smoking habit; every day approximately 50 people are admitted into hospital due to tobacco smoking and 1,600 (4 people per day) die from tobacco use every year in WA alone.

Now is as good a day as any to quit. There is help out there. Talk to your GP or call Quitline on 13 78 48, visit makesmokinghistory.org.au for information and resources or contact the Wheatbelt Cancer Council WA office or your closest Public Health Unit for any local quit smoking courses." 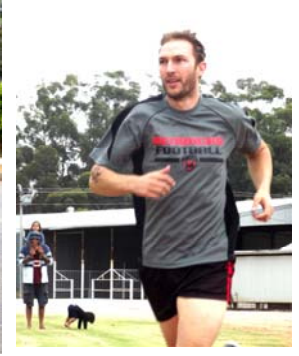
