All intending candidates for the forthcoming local government elections must undertake Local Government Candidate Induction online through the Department of Local Government, Sport and Communities website prior to nominating. Nomination information packs are available from the Shire office. Nominations open on Thursday 02 September and close at 4pm sharp on Thursday 09 September.

### Who is eligible?

If unable to personally attend to nominate, an authorised agent can do this on a candidate's behalf.

### Worrisome water plants

Keep your eyes peeled for salvinia and water hyacinth – two highly invasive plants that we need to eradicate from Western Australia. They have the ability to negatively impact our local ecosystems by out-competing local species and reducing water quality.

The costs and efforts taken to remove prohibited aquatic plants once they enter our environment, are massive. These plants can impede water flow, increase flooding and erosion, block agricultural irrigation channels, create health hazards and displace natural vegetation. This can cause a destruction of native floral and faunal environments. Some aquatic plants can even form thick mats to resemble groundcover, creating drowning hazards for people and livestock.

### Know what to look for

Salvinia (*Salvinia molesta*) is a perennial, free-floating aquatic fern that is made up of pairs of oval leaves connected by a horizontal stem. Salvinia's most distinct characteristic is the multitude of hairlike structures on the top of each leaf, which split and then re-join at the tips to form eggbeater-like structures which help them to float. The plant never

flowers and instead reproduces vegetatively – where floating stems that break apart can form entirely new plants.

Water hyacinth (*Eichhornia crassipes*) is also a perennial plant. It is erect, with large funnel-shaped lilac flowers that have six petals and a yellow centre. The leaves are hairless, glossy and have a spongy base that helps them to float. Leaves can either be narrow and standing upright, or round and curved upwards with wavy edges. Water hyacinths can reproduce via flower pollination, or vegetatively, and have submerged fruits carrying up to 300 seeds each. These 1mm seeds can remain viable for up to 20 years!

### Report it

Salvinia and water hyacinth are prohibited species under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007*, along with several other aquatic plants such as *Rotala rotundifolia*, water lettuce (*Pistia stratiotes*) and Senegal tea (*Gymnocoronis spilanthoides*). If you suspect you have found prohibited aquatic plants growing in your pond, dam, in the wild or advertised for sale, please contact the Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) or report it via MyPestGuide.

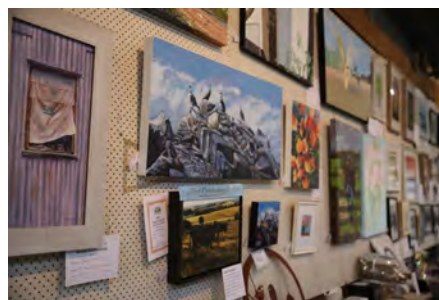
*Artists in Residence during August*

The hall was decorated reminiscent of the 1920s to help the audience step back in time and appreciate the musical production that little bit more.

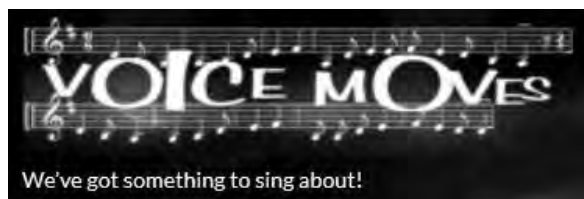

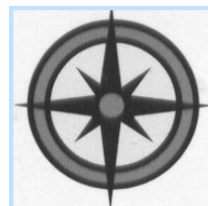

## Jacob's Well

**Jacob's Well** was said to be the site of an Aboriginal encampment whose leader was known as Jacob. Settlers took up land from the early 1900s & a progress association was established by 1910.

**School.** A tent school was erected in 1910 and the opening of the school was celebrated with a sports meeting followed by a social evening on December 16<sup>th</sup> 1910. The first teacher as Miss Hammond. The school was built on the land of Harry Green, a well-known settler of the area who lived to 100 years. In 1915 and 1920 contracts were let for renovations to the school and teacher's quarters. Other teachers were Miss Holland, Mr George Young, Miss Howard and Mrs Hart. Families who sent their children to the school included: Blatch, Blechynden, Davies, Dent, Doowan, Edwards, Green, Hart, Hastings, Heal, Jewell, Jones, Manning, Randell, Travers, Taylor, Wansbrough, Worrell and Young. The school closed in 1940 and children then went by school bus to Beverley State School. A plaque was erected at the school site by pioneer families in 1983.



**Agricultural Hall.** The hall was built on the corner of Jacob's Well and Manning Roads and opened in December 1912 by Mr F.T. Broun, M.L.A. It had corrugated iron roof & walls, and was lined with jarrah and asbestos ceelite plasterboard.

The hall was very much the centre of the community and used as a venue for picnics, sports days, socials, harvest festivals, farewells, welcomes, dances, meetings and church services. In February 1942 tenders were called for the purchase and demolition of Jacob's Well Agricultural Hall as it had been blown down in a fierce summer storm.



The WW1 Honour Board inside was relocated to Beverley Town Hall.

Lesley passed away peacefully in her sleep, Saturday morning the 7th August, age 95 years.

### *Life Member 1991*

Lesley began riding at an early age when she lived with her uncle & Aunt at Gwambygine. This was the foundation for her lifelong involvement with horses and ponies.

On the 17th May 1962 Lesley, several other interested families met for the purpose of forming a pony club. This Club was to cater for children from Pingelly, Brookton, Beverley, York and Quairading. By the end of this meeting Gilgering Pony Club was formed. The inaugural President was Lesley who remained in that position for the duration of Gilgering's affiliation with PCAWA.

In 1964 Lesley gained her "C" Instructor's Certificate. She gained her "B" Instructors Certificate in 1965

During her time in Pony Club Lesley has held many positions at various levels of Pony Club. Over the years she has served the club as President, Chief Coach, Zone Delegate, Treasurer, Instructor, Committee Member, Publicity Officer, Vice President, rally organiser and Club Patron. As a member of Central Zone which in turn became Avon Zone Lesley held various positions including PCAWA Delegate, Secretary/Treasurer and President. In 1967 she was elected Vice President of the PCAWA

Lesley spent many years as a member of the PCAWA Horse Trial Sub Committee which among many duties she carried out included the onerous task of allocating stewards to events. Her tireless work on behalf of this subcommittee was recognised in 2008 when she was presented with a special Award for 40 plus years of Service.

In 1991 she was made a Life Member of Beverley Horse and Pony Club in recognition of her long service to Pony Club.

Lesley was awarded the Australian Sports award for her work within Pony Club in 2000.

In 2008 Avon Zone Made a special presentation to Lesley recognising her many years of service to the zone.

Over the years Lesley trained many children to ride and enjoy horses and ponies. Many of Beverley's teams have succeeded at Zone, Interzone and State level under Lesley's guidance. She always tried to attend all the events the club entered and often could be seen at an ODE positioning herself for the greatest visual advantage to watch for her club's riders. Her enthusiasm and knowledge has rubbed off on many people over the years. Ex- members still contact Lesley to give her an update on their equestrian pursuits.

Her breeding of ponies has been nationally recognised with Drumclyer ponies taking many top awards over the years. Lesley often leased or sold cheaply her ponies to pony club members so that they could train, compete and enjoy being a part of pony club. This enabled many children who may not otherwise have been able to, to participate in pony club. Her equestrian contacts also enabled her to assist many parents to find just the right pony or horse for their child. An added advantage for members was being able to go out to the Drumclyer farm and ride in the open paddocks, under Lesley's instruction and encouragement, an experience not always available to town children but an ideal preparation for riding a cross country course.

The ideal that Pony Club is for an average Child on their average pony who may not excel at any one discipline but will have a go at all equestrian pursuits has been one of Lesley's lasting imprints on her club. Every rider should try to expand his or her horizons and knowledge through active hands-on experience in a safe and nurturing environment, while having fun.

## What Is Loss and Grief?

Grief is a universal, instinctual and an adaptive reaction to loss, particularly the grief from the loss of a loved one. Feelings of loss are very personal and only we know what is significant. Less obvious losses can also cause strong feelings of grief such as loss of possessions, job, relationship, health or physical ability.

Loss is an inevitable part of life and grief is a natural part of the healing process that varies for different people. The grieving process allows those left behind, after a death, to accept the person is no longer around. When experiencing and reacting to grief, it is common to:

- feel sad or depressed, anxious, nervous or fearful;
- be irritable or angry (at the deceased, ourself, others);
- feel frustrated or misunderstood;
- feel like we want to escape;
- experience guilt or remorse;
- be ambivalent, lack energy and motivation.

Each one of us has an individual style of coping with painful experiences (there is no right or wrong way). Some people don't show their grief in public but only express it in private. We don't always know how people are coping simply by what we see.

The following tips may help generate ideas about how to manage feelings of grief:

- talk to family, friends or a mate;
- engage in social activities;
- exercise and eat healthy foods;
- take time to relax, listen to music;
- seek counselling or join a support group;
- be patient and let ourselves feel grief.

The length of the grief process is different for everyone. It takes time to heal and this may not be just days it can be weeks, months and even years.

Grief comes in waves. When the ship is first wrecked, we're drowning, surrounded by wreckage reminding us of the ship that was and is no more, and all we can do is float. As we float we hang onto a piece of wreckage for a while in the form of a physical thing (a memory or photograph), it may even be another person floating with us, and for a while all we can do is float. In the beginning we have 10 metre waves crashing over us 10 seconds apart barely allowing us to breath. After a while (maybe weeks or months) the 10 metre waves still come crashing over us, but they are now further apart allowing us to breath and function without as much difficulty.

There will be triggers of grief that will arise (a song, a place, a photo) and a wave will come crashing down but in between there is life. Somewhere down the line (it is different for everybody) we find the waves are only 8 or 5 metres, they still come but are further apart. We will be able to see them coming (special anniversary days) but now we can prepare ourselves for the waves, knowing we will come out the other side, soaking wet, spluttering and still hanging onto a piece of wreckage but we will come out. Intermittent waves never stop coming and we don't really want them to, but we will survive them.

If we feel we are not coping, we need to seek professional help from our GP or a counsellor.

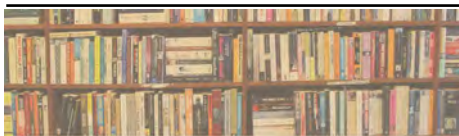

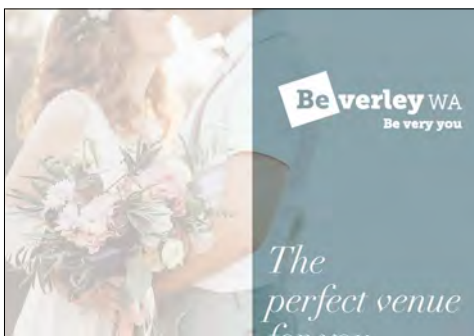

# SAFE & FOUND WA

Safe & Found WA is an initiative introduced by Western Australia Police Force and Australia Medic Alert Foundation.

Safe & Found supports people living with dementia or a cognitive impairment who might be at risk of becoming lost or reported as missing, by ensuring Police have immediate access to critical information to assist when undertaking search operations.

A detailed profile outlining your personal history and characteristics is completed ahead of time, and kept securely along with a recent photo, on the Safe & Found database for Police to access immediately if you go missing.

A Safe & Found ID bracelet is included with your membership to protect you when you're out in public. Your bracelet is engraved with the details needed to return you to safety should you appear lost or disoriented.

It's estimated that 6 out of 10 people living with dementia will wander at least once.

Planning ahead is the key to saving lives.

There may be important pieces of information you are able to provide Police in the event the person you are caring for has gone missing. Searchers use the information provided by you when you join Safe & Found to assist their search efforts and determine possible locations or specific lost person behaviour.

A completed Lost Person Behaviour Profile allows Police to focus their efforts more efficiently by allowing them a better understanding of whom they are looking for, what the person has done previously and may be likely to do in the future.

Lost Person Behaviour is a proven search strategy, reducing time and assisting in a safe return home.

St Mary's Church has been around since 1892. It once held a prominent place in society with many a wedding, baptism, confirmation and funeral held within. It remains a local landmark on the corner of John and Husking Streets, and still contributes to the community's sense of place. We would not be appealing for funds if we were able to source from elsewhere. The Anglican Diocese of the Church is unable to offer any significant assistance, State Heritage and Lotteries Commission no longer supply funds for Churches.

In general terms the following repairs are required. We have sourced estimates for each of these repairs and ongoing works in order of priority:

- Replacing the gutters, downpipes and redirecting the water flow at ground level. \$4,500 (soak wells extra)
- Internal west wall, repairs to rose window and internal cracks. \$25,000
- Renewal of external flashing to gables in west wall. \$4,000
- Repairs to internal cracks in south and north walls. \$19,250
- Repairs and paint to WW2 Lynch Gate and bell tower \$3,000
- Repainting external walls and roof surfaces incl. paint two coats. \$50,000
- Repainting interior walls, doors, window frames incl two coats \$19,250
- Hire of scaffolding and miscellaneous expenses approx. \$50,000

Approx. TOTAL Required \$175,000 Received so far \$44,000

## **New Anglican Priest in Beverley**

On Tuesday, 27<sup>th</sup> July members of the Anglican Church of St Mary, Beverley, gathered to welcome the Rev'd Canon Dr Philip Raymont as their Priest-in-Charge. The night before in Holy Trinity Church, York, Philip had been commissioned as the Priest-in-Charge for not only the Anglican parishes of York and Beverley-Brookton, but also Quairading.

This is a new initiative of the Anglican Diocese of Perth as it seeks to provide full-time ordained ministry in the rural parts of the Diocese. Under the new arrangements Philip will conduct regular services in each of the main centres, along with St John's in the Wilderness Church, The Dale, St Paul's Church, Edward's Crossing, and St Andrew's Church, Green Hills. As well as conducting worship he will visit each of the towns, and other places in the different Shires, each week. He expects that while it might be difficult to ensure walking 6,000 steps each day, he should have no problem in building up the number of kilometres travelled!

Philip is no stranger to Beverley, for over the last three and half years or more he has been conducting monthly Eucharists at St Mary's Church, Beverley and St Mark's Church, Brookton. For the last twelve years he has been the Senior Chaplain and Head of Religion, Philosophy & Ethics, at Guildford Grammar School in Perth. Given that background there are likely to be members of the Shire with a connection to that school; indeed, anyone of the six Perth Anglican Boarding schools.

Philip is not unfamiliar with rural living having grown up on mixed dairy and intensive agricultural farms in the Lockyer Valley between Toowoomba and Ipswich in Queensland; following his father's premature death in 1979 he operated for over five years the family farms with his father's brother. Philip is an historian of education by academic scholarship; having written two school histories, several articles in peer-reviewed journals of History and History of Education; having been admitted to his Doctorate in Philosophy from the University of Cambridge, Philip taught in the Faculty of Education there. Before travelling to the United Kingdom, Philip had led residential university colleges at the Northern Territory University, University of New England, the University of Melbourne, and the University of Queensland.

Within the life of the Diocese of Perth he is Chair of the Board, Wollaston Theological College; Chair, Archbishop's Examining Chaplains' Committee; a Canon of St George's Cathedral; a member of the Perth Committee of the Anglican Board of Mission; a member of the Diocesan Rural Ministry Task Force.

Amongst his hobbies and pastimes, he maintains particular interest in cultural and sporting events, having already attended several sporting events across the region and enjoyed Miss Westralia at the Beverley Town Hall recently.

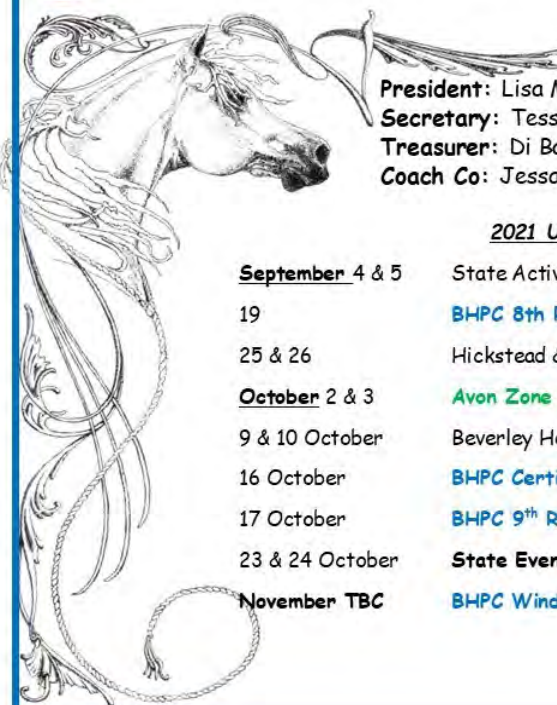
