Vincent Street Streetscape Project

I would like to say a sincere thank you again to the community and local businesses for your patience during the time Vincent Street was closed on 20 and 21 January. In the coming months when the resurfacing is to take place there could possibly be the need to close sections again, but we will know more as the project progresses.

Annual Report

Council is expected to receive the 2020/21 Annual Report in February. A date will then be set to hold the Annual Electors Meeting. I recently met with the Auditor General, Mrs Caroline Spencer to address some of the issues with the delays in receiving our Audit Report from the OAG. The meeting was very productive and I am hopeful a return to receiving the Annual Report in October and a November Annual Electors meeting will be possible in the future.

New Councillor

Cr Matt Norman was sworn in as a Councillor on Wednesday 19 January 2022. Cr Norman's previous experience on a metropolitan Council will no doubt add value and assist our current councillors. Council is now a full group of nine again.

Seniors Concert Cancellation

Due to the COVID-19 Border restrictions announced by the Premier on Thursday 20 January, the Seniors Concert scheduled for Monday 14 February will not go ahead due to the performer being unable to enter Western Australia. We apologise for this unavoidable inconvenience and hope to announce either a new date or different event in support of Senior Community.

Swimming Pool

Council had recently decided to throw its hat in the ring for Round 6 of the Better Building Regions Fund for the redevelopment of the Beverley Swimming Pool. A feasibility study and shovel ready building plans were completed by staff and the Community in 2020. Work commenced on the grant application and business plan in late December however Council and Staff were severely disheartened when the new Qualitive Survey priced the redevelopment at \$10.5M in January 2022. This figure increased from \$6.5M and consequently the grant application abandoned. Council and Staff will look to reapply for funding in future years when the market is more competitive.

Beverley Ag Museum News

Yes, it has been quite a while since any news came out from your local Ag Museum, so read on, and hopefully there will be more into the future.

Since the closure due to 'Health & Safety' issues well over 2 years ago (and then Covid came into our lives) our small but dedicated group of volunteers have been regularly maintaining the Beverley Shire Agricultural Machinery collection located on the site of the Avondale Farm in Waterhatch Rd, just 6 kms out of town.

During this period Council approached the public for their views for the future of our collection, it was decided to retain the collection and assess the viability of relocation closer to the Beverley Town Site given the local response, this has been budgeted for consideration in the 2022/2023 financial year.

Until relocation is considered our collection will remain at Avondale Farm, where the new National Trust Warden (welcome Robyn Smith) will be supporting our team with future operations (hopefully public openings) and historical research when her busy schedule provides time.

At our last meeting in November Robyn was 'introduced' by John Hawke to one of his well-loved exhibits, the David Brown Garden Tractor, after John's 'Hugging session' (in order to start the engine, it requires hands on both sides) Robyn drove the Tractor outside for cleaning, new members Bob & Paul were also seen operating a Caterpillar in the same area. It should always be remembered Beverley has the 'luxury' of a 'working collection' sure not all of it works, but there are many items that are not far off given some TLC, so we are always looking for new members and our crew are happy to offer our experiences and advice to newcomers and visitors.

Although we are still awaiting the 'Covid' health conditions before reopening, we usually hold an annual 'Busy Bee' in February to dust off the spider's webs and clean up around the place, and if we have enough time also maybe 'fire up' a few items.

Friend or Foe: Bees

What's that backyard buzz?

As the weather warms up, so does the insect activity, and in February we generally see an increase in bee reports. With the spotlight shining on the recent incursion of the exotic red-dwarf honeybee (*Apis florea*) in Forrestfield WA, it is important to think about how you may be able to tell the difference between friend and foe!

WA is home to approximately 1000 species of native bees, and these bees are vastly diverse in terms of size, form, colour and how social they are. In fact, most of them look and behave extremely differently to the European honeybee, *Apis mellifera*. The majority of our native bee species are solitary and do not belong to a hive or produce marketable quantities of honey like European honeybees. Instead, after mating the female will excavate shallow burrows in soil or find small holes to nest in wood, where their larvae can feed and develop.

Trending natives

Blue Banded Bees (*Amegilla* spp.) are furry bees coloured with iridescent blue or white stripes on a glossy black abdomen, and they can range between 10-12mm in length. In Australia, carpenter bees, teddy bear bees and blue banded bees are some of the few species able to perform what's known as 'buzz pollination'. Although most flowers can release their pollen automatically, some species like tomato plants can only release pollen when its flowers are vibrated repeatedly. Buzz pollination involves bees

clamping their legs to the anther (the male part of the flower typically containing pollen) and contracting their flight muscles vigorously to release the pollen.

The amazing handywork of female **leafcutter bees** (*Megachile* spp.) can be seen as perfectly neat circles or ovals cut out of the leaves in the garden. These are carefully transported back to the singular burrow she has excavated where she will then weave them into little cradles for her eggs to hatch. These bees range from 6-15mm in length.

Native bee resources

Keep a look out for our beautiful native bees this summer as they are excellent pollinators, and you can attract them into your garden by making a 'bee hotel'. Type the following search terms 'DIY Bee Hotel', 'AussieBee', 'Western Australian Museum' or 'native bees WA' into your internet search engine for the best information.

Get clicking!

Spotted an unfamiliar bee and not sure if it is a friend or foe? It's always better to reach for the camera before a fly swatter! Wherever possible, aim for clear photos that show their colours and body markings. If the bee is already dead, include a pen or ruler in the photo so we can judge its size and try photographing the wing vein pattern – it's very helpful with identifications of similar looking species.

My Health and Wellbeing - **Who's Responsible?**

We're often told, if unwell, get to the doctor and they will deal with our health and wellbeing issue. The doctor will often give a diagnosis, treatment options and other assistance through referrals and follow up. But it is us as individuals that must make decisions and take action which ultimately drives the outcome.

Based on some American research it is important to remember that one of the biggest determinants on our health (70%) are the decisions we make regarding wellbeing and lifestyle choices. It goes on to say that the remaining factors can vary between:

Genetics: It's important to know family history and our vulnerability to certain illness/disease.

Environment: What we are exposed to (trauma, poverty, stressors). Living and working in regional WA can be tough dealing with such things as isolation, extreme climates and working with machinery.

The health system: Tyranny of distance and a lack of male friendly services exacerbates this.

Undoubtedly the major impact is lifestyle choices! Reinforcing our takeaway message... *my health and wellbeing is my responsibility...*

We say our overall health and wellbeing is made up of physical, mental and social/spiritual aspects and to maintain all three, we as individuals need to be the driver. Whether dealing with situational distress, physical health problems, a diagnosed mental illness or an issue impacting our social/spiritual wellbeing (challenges around identity, meaning and purpose or our sense of belonging), the doctor will provide the framework to follow but decisions and changes ultimately need to be made by us.

Making informed decisions are a part of life, whether it's to do with family, work and social activities, why then should our health and wellbeing be any different? Blokes in general are action orientated but making decisions and acting on things that can negatively impact our wellbeing can be put off. The warrior attitude is an admirable attribute especially when dealing with sporting, business or seasonal adversity. However, this same attitude can lead to negligence and not putting ourselves first. We have all seen the numerous health campaigns "A simple test could save your life", "don't delay" or "know your score", but we also constantly hear similar comments from blokes when discussing health and wellbeing issues:

It won't happen to me / she'll be right.

We know the issues, but we don't want to show ourselves as the only one with a problem.

I will just see how it goes (the back pain I've had for 6 months).

The buck stops with us blokes to be the decision maker on health and wellbeing issues, it's not the doctor's, wife's or employers' responsibility, but ours! Remember the three C's of life: Choices, Chances, Changes. You must make a choice to take a chance, or your life will never change.

Diet, exercise and sleep are three areas you can start making some simple changes to help improve your health and wellbeing outcomes and remember a routine service visit could reduce the risk of some expensive repairs down the track. Make an appointment with your GP to discuss your individual risk factors, don't wait till it becomes a chronic health problem.

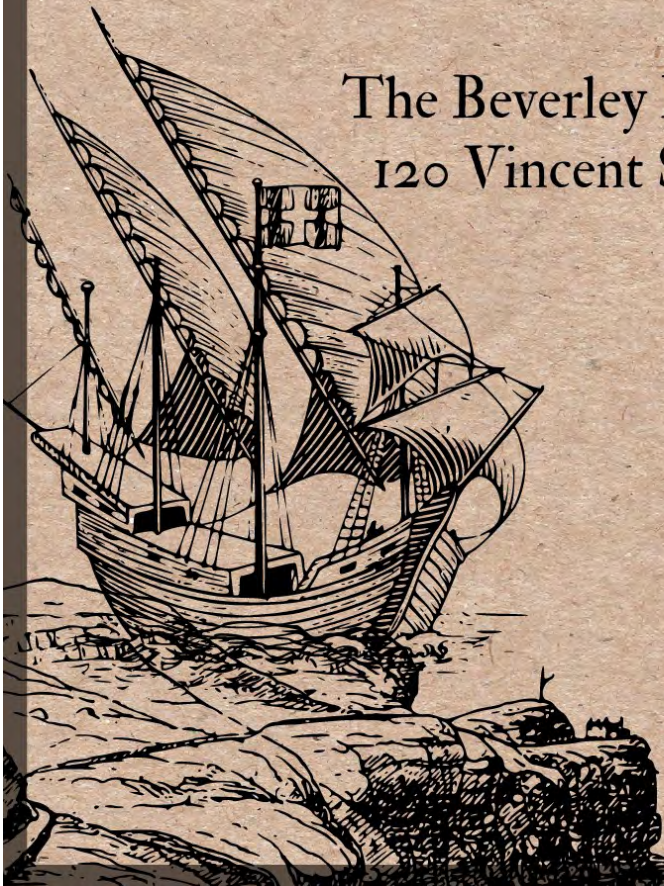

FUN FACTS



1. People started exchanging cards and handwritten letters to both lovers and friends during the 17th century, but it was in the 1840s that the first Valentine's Day cards were mass-produced in the U.S., sold by Esther A. Howland.
2. Americans spent over \$20 billion on Valentine's Day gifts in 2019 and were expected to spend a record-breaking \$27.4 billion for 2020 — including \$2.4 billion on candy alone!
3. People also expected to spend an average of approximately \$196 for Valentine's Day, with men spending around \$291 compared to women spending \$106.
4. The first heart-shaped box of chocolates was introduced in 1861. It was created by Richard Cadbury, son of Cadbury founder John Cadbury, who started packaging chocolates in fancy boxes to increase sales.

Veer Singh – The Travelling Trader

Leo Bartram, a landowner in The Dale, wrote about Veer Singh in his memoir, "Reminiscences about the Dale Area". His words were used to illustrate a time between the two world wars in the publication of Beverley's history: "*Beverley: Our Journey Through Time*", Chapter Five: 'Coming to Grips with Adversity' 1914-1939, by G McLaren & W Cooper, published by the Shire of Beverley in 2002.



"A regular highlight in farm life, especially for children, was the arrival of the Afghan hawker, Veer Singh. His two-horse wagon had:

... a dog tied behind with a bag swung above it. When the dog got tired it jumped up onto the bag! Veer Singh would visit two or three times a year and it was absolutely amazing the amount of stuff he could get in that van – all first quality. He was noted for his moleskin trousers and white-handled pocketknives. They were good knives. I had several over the years. I don't think they were Joseph Rodgers', but they were Sheffield Steel. From August till Christmas he always carried a lot of red dresses to catch the natives when they got their shearing cheques.

In his heyday he could lift up a bundle of clothes with one hand and pull out a pair of trousers from underneath with the other, show them to you, and if you didn't want them, give them a flip back into their fold, take the other hand away and they would drop down as if never been touched. I wouldn't have been able to do that in a hundred years...

After he left us on his last visit, he turned the van over on a steep bank. It was near my neighbour's place (Dave Allen – now farming in the York district). The family looked after him for about a week. He was badly shaken up but, with their care and attention, he was soon back on the road again. Not long after that we heard he had been found sitting up in his wagon, dead."

Members of the local community made arrangements for his body to be cremated.

Veer Singh was frequently referred to as an Afghan hawker but he was in fact a Sikh and would have come from India. Veer Singh is one of many Sikhs in Western Australia honoured at the Sikh Heritage Trail in Adenia Park, Riverton, near the historic cremation site for Sikhs in Perth.

Beverley Tree & Garden Society

Welcome to a very hot 2022. I hope that you are managing to save your garden with plenty of mulch, water and shade. And don't forget to treat yourself much the same, at least the shade and plenty of water. The garden club is taking a break until March when we have the next meeting on the 1st of March at Valery Seeber's home at 10.30am. We will meet at the Dead Finish at 10am for those who don't know the way. Please bring a chair. All welcome.

TREE & GARDEN SOCIETY

Gardening during February is an exciting time as you can start to plan your autumn and winter garden.

Vegetables to plant in February include: lettuce, broccoli, Brussels sprout, cabbage, cauliflower, peas, radish, shallot and silverbeet.

Flowers to plant in February include: begonia, cornflower, pansy, salvia, statice, stock, sweet pea, verbena and hollyhock.

February is a great time to attend to the following tasks in your garden:

- Pots can dry out quickly in summer as potting mix becomes hydrophobic. Apply wetting agent so water gets into the soil rather than running down the sides of the pot
- Freshen up indoor and undercover potted plants by wiping dusty leaves with a damp cloth or taking them outside when it is raining
- Check your veggie and herb garden daily for grubs and caterpillars and pick them off to keep them under control
- Cut back Callistemon and Hakea by a third to promote healthy, compact growth
- Prune Banksia and Grevillea lightly to shape after flowering. Remove all dead, weak or rubbing branches
- Pull off any suckering growth from below the graft on roses
- Lightly trim Bougainvillea after flowering to encourage more blooms
- Pot plants can dry out quickly in the hot wind. Moved exposed pots to more sheltered locations
- Tip prune Passionfruit regularly to promote lateral growth on which fruit will form
- If branches on variegated species revert to plain green, always cut these out or they can start to take over the plant
- Include daisies in and around your vegie garden to attract beneficial insects for pollination
- Water camellias deeply in dry times to reduce bud drop
- Prune hydrangeas back to 2 or 3 buds as blooms finish
- Prune flowering gums 20 – 30cm behind spent flowers for more flowers next year
- Cut canna lily spent flower stems to ground level

Find Cancer Early in 2022

Cancer Council WA is asking people over 40 years of age in regional WA to make their health a priority in 2022 by knowing the two different ways to detect cancer early. Cancer Council WA's Wheatbelt Regional Education Officer Kaylor Andrews said one way is to be cancer symptom aware and visit your local medical clinic if symptoms exist.

"Research indicates regional West Aussies tend to present at the GP at a later stage for a number of reasons including because they can be more optimistic, laid back and sometimes make excuses for not seeking help, which may contribute to later stage cancer diagnoses," Kaylor said.

"The Find Cancer Early program is designed to tackle some of these relaxed attitudes and motivate people with symptoms to push past the barriers and seek medical advice as soon as possible."

"The program also aims to inform regional West Aussies of the symptoms of the five most common cancers – prostate, breast, skin, bowel and lung cancer – which make up around 60 per cent of new cancers diagnosed in WA each year."

Kaylor recommended regional people could be symptom aware in 2022 by printing off the cancer symptom checklist from www.findcancerearly.com.au/ and putting it on the bathroom mirror or fridge as a regular reminder.

Cancer Council WA recommends visiting your GP, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker if you experience any of the below symptoms:

- blood in your poo, blood in your pee or you've coughed up blood, even just on one occasion
- Or for more than four weeks you've noticed problems peeing, unexplained weight loss, an unusual pain, lump or swelling anywhere in your body, shortness of breath, a persistent cough, or changes to your bowel habits, including runny poo, pooping more often or constipation

"Whatever the outcome, it's best to find out what's going on early and get onto any recommended treatment. If it turns out to be nothing you have peace of mind and can save yourself the uncertainty of the 'wait and see' approach," she said.

"The other way to detect cancer early is to participate in the three national screening programs. It's important to remember the national screening program tests such as the National bowel cancer screening program 'poo testing' kit, BreastscreenWA mammograms and cervical screening are designed for people who aren't experiencing symptoms."

"If you do not have any symptoms and you are eligible, please participate in Australia's free national cancer screening programs (available for bowel, breast, and cervical cancer)."
