SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Budget Preparation 2023/2024

Work is now in hand for the preparation of the Financial Budget for 2023 / 2024. As much as the Council will work towards keeping rate increase to levels set in previous years, Ratepayers need to be aware that the financial world in which we now live and work is quite different to recent years. The situation today is somewhat similar for those who can remember the 70s with rampant inflation.

Local Government Reform

The Minister for Local Government is pressing ahead with the reforms he is proposing, among which are the reforms for elections. In brief, there is to be compulsory preferential voting for the large Councils but this was supposed to be an option for smaller Councils such as us. Beverley would prefer to retain our first-past-the-post method used in the past. Unfortunately, the Department seems to be confusing the issue leaving us in doubt. If we have to use this method we will have to engage the Electoral Commission who have given us a quote of \$18,000 to carry out this function. A letter has been sent to the Minister questioning this and pointing out to him that further costs such as this we do not need especially when the Preferential voting achieves precisely nothing for our purposes.

We still await a reply.

Community Grant Programme

The final phase of this Programme for 2022/2023 has been concluded and the recipients were: Horse and Pony Club, Community Garden, Lawn Tennis Club, Golf Club, Masonic Lodge, and Friends of the Dale River. Council budgets \$20,000 annually to this Programme and I am pleased to advise that it has been fully allocated.

Chronicle Cemetery Digitisation

Council have recently completed a cemetery record digitisation project for all cemeteries within the townsite. Drone aerial surveying created high resolution images of each cemetery so that families and friends are able to conduct real-time enquiries on the database. Integrated Planning

Council is required to review the Strategic Community Plan this year. The Plan maps out the vision and direction for Council for the next ten years. Dates and places are still to be confirmed for these consultations so please check Facebook and the Blarney.

Fairbridge Festival

The Beverley Station Arts committee were approached to consider hosting the annual 'Fairbridge Festival'. After researching the festival, Beverley Station Arts were keen to work collaboratively with the Shire of Beverley to bring an amazing established event to Beverley that would benefit the whole community. With Council approval, a proposal was developed and submitted in early March. An outcome is expected in the coming weeks.

Seniors and Community Concert

Alert for this event later in the year. Wednesday 2nd August 2023. A matinee showing of "Don't Shoot Me, I'm Only The Piano Player" by David Scheel. This was supposed to have occurred in 2020 so keep your fingers crossed.

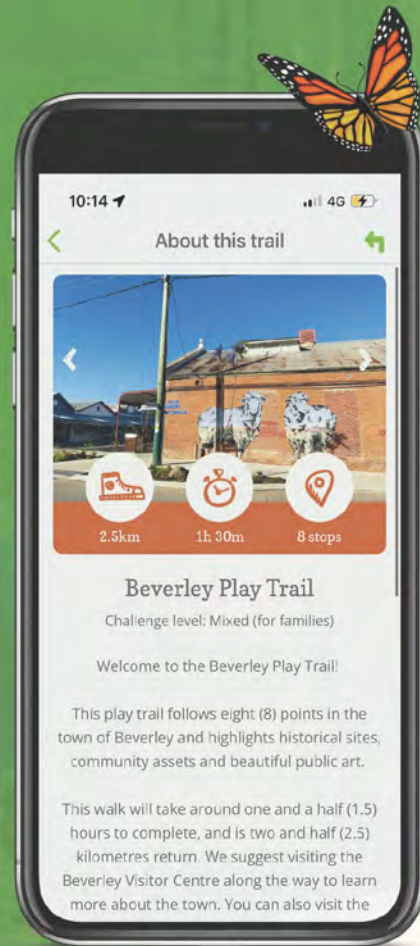

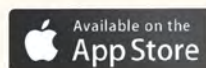
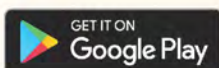


How to use the Play Trails app

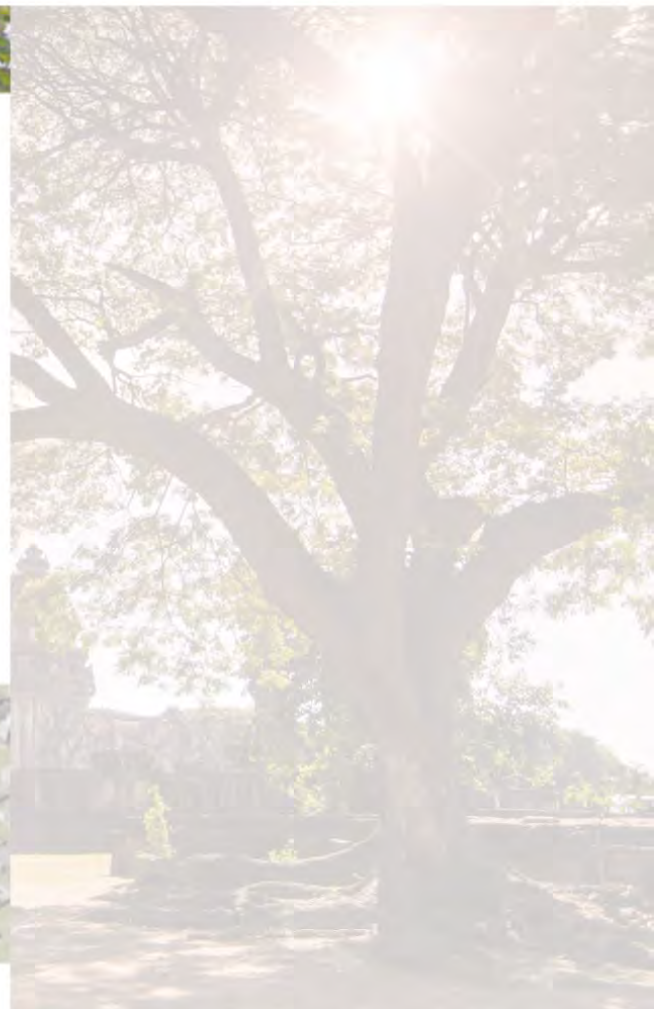

Jessie Christina Clifton

The Beverley Hospital Matron Who Went to War

Jessie Christina Clifton was born in 1876 to Walter & Louisa Clifton in Australind, WA. As an adult she trained as a nurse at Kalgoorlie Hospital.

In 1911 she applied to the Beverley Board of Health to register the premises at the corner of Lukin and Harper streets as a Private Hospital. After a visit from the Health Officer the license was granted. For a couple of years from that time, there are reports in the *Beverley Times* of individuals who met with accidents or needing nursing care being admitted to Nurse Clifton's hospital. For example, the following appeared on 28 June 1913:

Whilst Master George Bremner was driving to school on Wednesday morning the horse became frightened and bolted, upsetting the sulky, which went over him and broke his right thigh bone. He was conveyed to Mr. Oliver's house nearby, where Dr. Morgan Richards fixed him up temporarily and had him removed to Nurse Clifton's private hospital. Later in the day the broken limb was set, and so far the patient is progressing satisfactorily.



In 1914 Nurse Clifton applied for and was appointed Matron of the original Beverley Public Hospital (pictured).

But war was looming and on 12 June 1915 Jessie Clifton then aged 39 enlisted in Beverley for the Australian Army Nursing Service.

She began with rank of Sister and was later promoted to Matron.

Her first transportation was from Fremantle on 22 July 1915 aboard the HMAT "Orsova". On reaching the middle east she performed her duties in Egypt and on the Hospital Ship "Kanowna" dealing with the wounded returning from Gallipoli.

Her second transportation was from Fremantle on 23 December 1916 aboard "Berrima" to the European war zone, returning on the "Ayrshire". In between transportation she served at the 8th Australian Army Hospital at Fremantle

Her third transportation was from Sydney aboard RMS "Orontes". In England she served at the Australian Army Hospital, Southall. She returned on the "Arawa" & was discharged from the Army on 13 December 1918 after three and a half years active service.

She was awarded three medals: the 1914/15 Star, the British War Medal, and the Victory Medal. After the war Jessie Clifton was Matron at the Barracks Hospital, Fremantle and President of the WA Returned Nurses Trust. In WW2 she was Matron of Faversham Hospital, York.

Miss Jessie Clifton was awarded the M.B.E. by King George VI in the 1950 birthday honours list. The evacuation of wounded from Gallipoli in August, 1915, and the first zeppelin raid on London are

experiences which she will never forget, said Sister Clifton at the time.

Sister Clifton, J is the only female name on the Beverley WW1 War Memorial in Vincent St.





Understanding Aphids

Aphids are small, soft-bodied, sap sucking insects which belong to the order Hemiptera. Let's examine some unique biological features about aphids to better understand why they are so difficult to control.

- **Host plant range:** Many species of aphids can feed on a wide range of host plants, which makes it difficult to control infestations in mixed plantings. These aphids are referred to as 'polyphagous' and includes the green peach aphid which feeds on a wide range of crops including vegetables, fruit trees, and ornamental plants.
- **Rapid reproduction:** Aphids can reproduce asexually through a process called parthenogenesis, where females give birth to live young without mating with a male. This allows aphid populations to grow rapidly under favourable conditions, and some species produce 20+ generations a season.
- **Developmental plasticity & dispersal:** Aphids can produce alates (winged aphids) in response to changes in environmental conditions. A drop in food quality, overcrowding or increased

predation pressure can alter their development and produce winged individuals to aid in aphid dispersal.

- **Ant mutualism:** Some species of aphids have a mutualistic relationship with ants, which can protect them from predators and parasitoids. This can make it difficult to control aphid populations without also addressing the ant presence.
- **Insecticide resistance:** Some aphid populations have developed resistance to commonly used insecticides, which can make control even more challenging.

Understanding these factors can help you develop effective strategies for managing aphids. This may include cultural practices like removing infested plants, biological control methods like introducing natural predators or parasitoids, and careful use of insecticides that are effective against the specific aphid species present.

If you don't recognise the aphid you are trying to control, please report it.

WARRIOR WELLBEING ARTICLE

We Are Not The Same – Is It Embedded In Our Masculinity?

Quite often as blokes we have been told to get in touch with our feminine side. Over time this narrative has been part of the language barrier that has put bloke's positive approaches to wellbeing issues and help seeking in reverse.

There are three parts to our health: physical, mental and social/spiritual wellbeing. The latter is where we find: our identity, our individuality, our own sense of self, our sense of belonging, our passions and interests and our emotional *context* (not a feminine side!)

We are the same species but putting it simply men and women have evolved differently. Our DNA is 99.6% similar but it is that 0.4% difference that we need to talk about and address, because it helps explain why blokes have a warrior attitude to life and in turn helps explain why we seek help differently.

There are three main areas of difference that we talk about in the work we do:

1. Communication

- On average blokes will talk one third less than ladies per day (7,000 words to 21,000 words) this starts from a young age from boys through to men. Anyone with a wife, mother, mother-in-law, daughter, or partner will know this. Ladies, talking is a good thing as it helps address/highlight a whole lot of issues.
- It is perfectly normal for blokes to talk in dot points or even just grunt!

2. Risk-taking

- Blokes are hard wired to take risks from an early age. Some of this is linked to our brain development. The brain development stage for a lady is roughly between the ages of 18 to 20 years, whereas for a bloke it is between the ages of 25 to 28 years (some may say 45 to 50 years!)
- As we get older, we get wiser, but we are still hard wired to take risks.

3. Winning (an important part of the warrior culture)

- The majority (90%) of Aussie men think winning is important (a trait that can be traced back to our true warrior days, hunting for survival);
- An alarming statistic is that 50% of blokes think winning is all that matters. So quite often blokes don't take a backward step when it comes to finances, relationships and/or business matters.

The importance blokes place on winning, explains why a loss event and/or a sense of loss becomes problematic and can be hard to deal with. Combine this with the lack of understanding of our emotions and we may be a ticking time bomb.



As blokes we need to be more aware of our emotions and that it is alright to show them. We will all experience emotional issues throughout our lives. During these times we should openly express our emotions maybe through a hug or a cry and/or use language that is foreign to us i.e. I am sad, and/or I am struggling here.

Talk to a Mate®!! It is beneficial, and you will realise that it's not just you that may be struggling, there's a lot of other blokes out there feeling the same way.

Healthy Apple Crumble Recipe



Ingredients

- 2 apples, chopped
- 50 g margarine
- 1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar (or regular sugar)
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup plain flour
- 1 cup rolled oats

Method

1. Preheat oven to 200°C (180°C fan forced).
2. Place the apple pieces in a small baking dish.
3. Cook apples on HIGH in microwave for 5 minutes or until soft.
4. In small bowl, combine the remaining ingredients.
5. Mix with fingertips until it has an even crumb texture.
6. Top the apple with the crumb mixture and bake in the oven for 20 minutes or until the crumble is golden brown.

TREE & GARDEN SOCIETY

Beverley Garden & Tree Society

The first meeting for 2023 was held in Gracie's lovely outdoor areas. Thank you Gracie for making your home available to us and for the tempting Morning tea/lunch. Linley warmly welcomed us all and introduced a new member, Tim. The proposed agenda for the year was discussed and amended where necessary so we have an interesting programme ahead.

Tim introduced a problem that he is having with a plague of Carpophylus beetles which are decimating his fruit crop. The traps and pheromones needed for bait are prohibitively expensive so the best way to control these pests is good orchard hygiene, such as picking up and disposing of affected fruit. If anyone has any further information on controlling these beetles, please let us know.

We also had a Busy Bee at the Dead Finish garden as it has become a bit overgrown in places and several bushes were in need of pruning. Thank you to those members who braved the very warm morning to help with the tidy up.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday the 4th of April. We will have a short Busy Bee in the Dead Finish garden at 8.20 am, followed by the meeting at 10.30am in the museum.

What a great time to be gardening in April. The days are getting shorter and the nights are much cooler. A perfect time to be planting in the garden.

Vegies to plant in April include – broccoli, cabbage, leek, lettuce, onions, peas, radish, shallots, spinach, spring onion and turnip.

Flowers to plant in April include – alyssum, cornflower, snapdragon, stock, statice, pansy, sweet pea and viola.

April is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- ☆ Aerate compacted lawns with a garden fork
- ☆ Lift and divide bearded iris
- ☆ Remove and discard any diseased or rotten fruit that may be hanging in trees
- ☆ Repot plants that have outgrown their containers. Use fresh potting mix and a slow release fertiliser
- ☆ Mass plant ground covers to create a living carpet to suppress weeds. Good native ground covers include native violet and grevillea
- ☆ Empty compost bins and use it to condition vegetable and flower beds and spots where you plan to plant bare-rooted trees and shrubs in winter
- ☆ Prune hedges of lavender and rosemary
- ☆ Plant annuals for winter and spring colour. Try pansy, cineraria, viola, poppy, primula and stock
- ☆ Prune summer fruiting trees that have finished cropping. Pruning after harvest reduces the risk of fungal disease and gives the trees a chance to put on some growth before winter
- ☆ Trim native shrubs by about a third after they have finished flowering
- ☆ Prune any potted plants that are looking tired and lanky by half
- ☆ Top up slow release fertilisers in all pot plants to replace nutrients leached out by regular summer watering
- ☆ Apply a wetting agent to pots if water runs straight down the side of the pot and the potting mix below the surface stays dry
- ☆ This is the perfect time to establish native trees and shrubs such as bottlebrush, wattle and banksia.

There is certainly plenty to do to keep you busy in your garden in April!

We are on a transformation journey...

In case you didn't know, BDHS have embarked on a special 3 year improvement program with Fogarty EDvance. This is something we nominated ourselves to do, we know we are a good school, but we aspire to be up there with the best!

We are now in our second year of Fogarty EDvance. Through this program we have access to some amazing resources, the most up to date research, an experienced mentor principal who guides us along the way, and we also get to visit and work with high performing schools. We are delighted that many of

our existing teaching practices and programs already in place here at BDHS, have been highlighted as best practice through Fogarty EDvance. If we just focus on Literacy for a start, let's take a sneak peek into the classrooms and see what some of this looks like...

PreLit – Kindy

Our lovely new Kindy students are settling into school life well. There are lots of new routines to learn and lots of opportunities for play – both structured and unstructured. We use a Literacy program called 'PreLit' in Kindy, it helps to lay a solid foundation to prepare children for learning to read. There are lots of fun and engaging games and activities built into this program.



Fine motor and oral language development in Kindy

InitialLit – Pre-primary, Year 1 and Year 2

InitialLit explicitly teaches the skills our students require to become successful readers and writers. It is linked to the Kindy PreLit program, making a fabulous link between Kindy and Pre-Primary learning. InitialLit allows for extension, so high achieving students can be advanced. The program assessment tool also identifies student requiring additional support. We provide this support through the MiniLit and MacqLit literacy intervention programs. All these programs are created by MultiLit – a leading provider of effective literacy instruction, all grounded in scientific evidence based best practice!

In Years 3-6 we use Critical Reading to analyse what a text means, and learn lots of new vocabulary. We work in triads to discuss comprehension questions and use a process called 'stand and deliver' when we address the class with our insights about a text. We use complex texts with interesting language in these lessons.

We are using a writing program called Seven Steps in Years 3-6. It focuses on teaching students to write in an engaging way. It 'bans the boring' and teaches students to write in an interesting manner. We are loving some of the persuasive 'sizzling starts' the students have been working on.
