SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Regional Precincts and Partnership Program (“rPPP”)

As reported earlier, there are two stages for this program. Stream 1 is for Grants to enable parties to pay for planning. Ranging from \$500,000 to \$5 million. Stream 2 is for Grants to assist in construction of the planned projects. Ranging from \$5 million to \$50 million. The Shire had applied under Stream 2 for funds for the swimming pool redevelopment and that was lodged in February 2024. Recent notification was received that that application was unsuccessful. Unfortunately, it means that the Shire is not able to carry out the plan for the complete redevelopment of the area. Lesser work will now be carried out.

Air Show 11th April 2026

At the time of writing this Report, this matter will be presented to Council at the regular monthly meeting on 26th March. At that meeting, Council will be required to either commit to this event or withdraw. The amount of work yet to be done for the Air Show is considerable and the Committee need to have certainty in order to continue with the arrangements. It may seem to be early for this decision but with only twelve months to go, the time frame is short.

I would like to acknowledge and thank other organisations and individuals who are assisting in this venture:

The partnership the Shire has with the Beverley Soaring Society who have embraced this event with enthusiasm. Their contribution in supplying expertise and manpower to organise the day’s events is greatly appreciated. Without their assistance, it is doubtful whether the Shire would have sufficient resources to proceed;

The Beverley Rifle and Gun Club for permitting their land to be used for parking on the day; and,

Mr. Ian Edwards for altering his farming programme in 2025 by choosing not to crop the land leased from the Beverley Rifle and Gun Club in order to avoid stubble hazard in 2026.

Bridges within the Shire

Work on the **Bremner Road bridge** has finally commenced and the works are progressing well. Demolition has been completed. The first concrete pour was completed on Monday 17th March and the second was completed on Friday 21st March. This completes the footing to enable the box sections to now be laid.

Bridge 3197 on the York Williams Road has been slowed up due to heavy rain on 13th March. Water has been flowing through this area since then. The pumps are only now just starting to control the flow and this will enable work on the creek bed to continue. Any further delays may push out completion date beyond 30th June 2025.

Restricted Burning Season

At the meeting of Bush Fire Control Officers held on Wednesday 19th March, consideration was given to extending the Restricted Burning Season until Monday 14th April. A final decision on this will be made at the end of March and notification will be provided to the community.

In Brief

- **Swimming Pool development.** As notified earlier, the Shire will be proceeding with a partial development of the Aquatic Centre commencing at the close of the current season in April. Work that will be carried out includes: new pump house and plumbing, new ramp and stair access, new children’s and learner’s pool, a new lining for the bowl, and some landscaping.
- **Lopping.** Rural road lopping will commence on 24th March. This will begin on Jones Road and Schillings Road and will last for between 6 to 7 weeks.
- **Civic Centre Carpark.** The area behind the Shire Offices and Civic Centre has now been levelled, formed, and Hotmix laid to create one carpark. The carport construction is scheduled to commence early in April, followed by the line marking to complete the project. Pleasingly this whole project was completed in-house at a cost considerably lower than any of the Tenders received for this work.
- **W.A. Vintage Speedster Car Club.** This organisation has approached the Shire with an offer to hold an annual event of racing their vehicles at the Old Racecourse. Confirmation of this is subject to other parties who have use of this area.

Main Roads Roadworks

York Williams Road – Road Closure 13 January to June 2025 - Bridge 3197 Replacement

York Williams Road will be closed for a bridge replacement between 13 January and June 2025.

Bridge 3197 is approximately 11 kms from the Great Southern Highway just south of Beverley.

The new bridge will have two traffic lanes unlike the old bridge which is a single lane bridge.

Great Southern Highway – Road Rehabilitation and Shoulder Sealing – Beverley to Brookton

Shoulder sealing and road rehabilitation on Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton is progressing well and is due for completion by the end of January 2025.

We appreciate the patience shown by road users to enable a safe work site.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.

Great Southern Highway – Shoulder Sealing – York to Beverley

Culvert extensions are currently underway between Young Road and Beverley and scheduled for completion mid-November 2024. Shoulder sealing will shortly commence in January 2025 until May 2025.

There will be lane closures and speed restrictions in place, so please allow extra travel time.

Public Notice

On Wednesday 26 February 2025, the Shire of Beverley Council resolved to specify the Beverley Oval as a Dog Exercise Area as per s31(31A) and (31C) of the *Dog Act 1976*. Specifying the oval is to focus on responsible dog ownership and create safe public spaces for all users and will come in effect on 1 May 2025.

Dog Exercise Area Rules

1. Off leash permitted - persons responsible must have their registered dog/s under control and in sight at all times, owners must carry a lead of sufficient length and strength to attach dog/s when required.
2. When any sporting activities or maintenance takes place, dogs must be on-lead and walked around the outside of the oval. If the oval is hired out, dogs are at the discretion of the hirer.
3. The person/s responsible must clean up immediately after the dog – BAG IT, BIN IT. The primary use of the oval is for human recreation and fines may apply. The Shire provides free bags, please use them.
4. The person in charge of the dog must ensure that the dogs behaviour is not to the detriment of others. If the dog becomes distressed, unruly or shows any signs of aggression it must be leashed and removed immediately.

Ahhhh not only are we sighing in relief from the Summer, but our garden is too. Lovely cool mornings have been enjoyed by our volunteers as we prepare our garden beds for the winter vegetables.

The spent tomato vines have been pulled up, the passionfruit are resting and the netting has been removed from the grapes with the slim pickings of remaining grapes being enjoyed by the birds.

Over the last few weeks, our regular volunteers have been extra busy planting seeds and seedlings so that you can be assured some lovely hearty vegetables in the upcoming months. We have planted varieties of Spinach and lettuce as well as Beetroot, Garlic (380 cloves) Cauliflower, Broccoli, Brussel Sprouts, Cabbage, Silver beet, Kahlrabi and Onions.

The Donkey Society of WA will bring their friendly donkeys for you to meet and enjoy. Wheatbelt Draught Horses will bring their horse, Betty, to demonstrate traditional Horseworks at the 1890's Stables. Additionally, Clydesdales will be in the Stables for visitors to admire and interact with. The circa 1850's Homestead will also be open for exploration, where you can step back in time and learn about life in the past or simply enjoy the views and tranquility from the verandah.

Feel free to bring a picnic and enjoy it in the peaceful country setting, with picnic tables available around the Playground, Homestead, and Gazebo along the Drive Trail. A scenic Drive Trail, with an informative map, offers a beautiful route through the farm. FIVE LOCAL CLUBS ACROSS AUSTRALIA SELECTED FOR 'THE CARLTON DRAFT' IN 2025



The Carlton Draft is excited to reveal the five local clubs from across Australia that will draft an AFL legend to their footy club for a one-off game this season.

Now in its fourth campaign, The Carlton Draft supports local footy by giving registered senior men's footy clubs a chance to draft former AFL icons.

Official Draft Recruiter **Dylan Buckley** and Draft Commissioner **Jonathan Brown** have been hard at work getting the new draftees signed up for this season, resulting in a draft class comprising of 1,437 AFL games between **Tom Hawkins, Brett Deledio, Matthew Pavlich, Travis Cloke** and **Will Schofield**.

The five selected clubs with a pick in this year's The Carlton Draft are:

For the first time ever, The Carlton Draft is heading beyond Victoria thanks to **Carlton Dry**, with a club in Western Australia and in New South Wales to have a selection on draft night.

This year's campaign saw over 150 clubs from across Australia nominating for a chance to receive a selection and ultimately draft a former AFL star to their football club.

Winning clubs will be able to select their legend during The Carlton Draft night, held on Wednesday 30 April at The Sporting Globe in Richmond, before the matchdays commence.

"It was great to have Dyl Buckley join The Carlton Draft team in an official capacity this year after being a part of the playing crop in 2024.

"It's safe to say he is much better served as a recruiter after his underwhelming performance on the field. He has pulled together an unbelievable talent pool of AFL legends.

"The Carlton Draft is all about giving back to the local footy clubs and communities, so for it to be able to expand outside of Victoria and into Western Australia and New South Wales is a huge step forward for the campaign. We've got some excited clubs who are itching to select their draftee, I can't wait to see the campaign come to life for another edition."

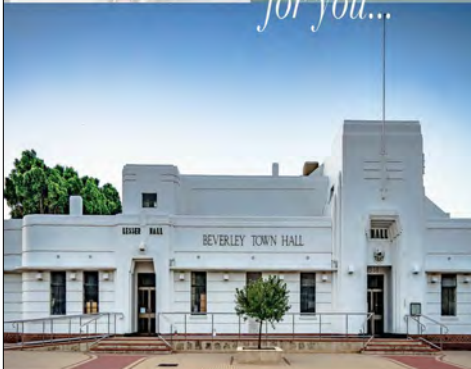
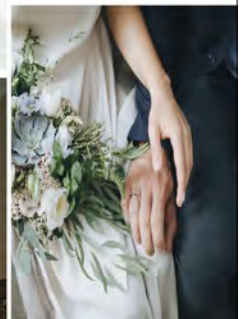

Mapping groundwater from a helicopter in the Brookton-Beverley area

Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) are working in partnership with Australia's national science agency, CSIRO, and the local governments of Brookton and Beverley to better understand the water resources of the Brookton-Beverley palaeochannel.

A helicopter will be used to conduct an airborne electromagnetic (AEM) survey in the area between June and July 2025. The survey will help to identify groundwater resources and their suitability for agriculture and community use.

Brookton-Beverley survey

The survey is planned to take place in June or July 2025 and will last for about 2 weeks. Updates will be made via Shire notices and newsletters.

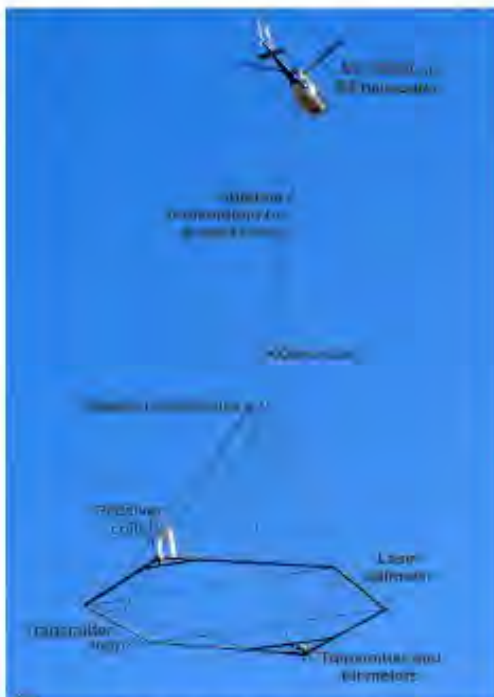


Figure 1 Typical helicopter AEM system to be used to fly the survey

A helicopter will fly low – about 60 m above the ground and will have a large circular frame underneath it. The helicopter tows the circular frame about 30-40 m above the ground. The helicopter will fly along parallel lines that are 300 m to 500 m apart across the survey area (Figure 1).

What is AEM?

The scientific name of the survey method being used is airborne electromagnetics (AEM). The AEM system is carried by a helicopter and measures the changes in conductivity (an indicator of soil and water quality) of the ground.

The signals generated by the helicopter AEM system are weaker than those from mobile phones and TV antennas. AEM is non-invasive, which means that it does not change soil, groundwater or surface water in any way.

The community will hear noise from the helicopter while the survey is being done. The helicopter will keep approximately 300 m from houses and other structures.

Why use AEM?

A helicopter AEM system is a quick and cost-effective method to map the area as it can provide detailed information in a very short period.

AEM techniques were developed specifically for land and groundwater assessments. They have been used for over 30 years in the Wheatbelt to understand how salinity and groundwater vary beneath the landscape.

The AEM survey will be used to locate the Brookton-Beverley paleochannel. The data the helicopter collects will tell us more about the groundwater, so that both local and state government, and landowners, can better manage water in the region.

How do helicopter AEM systems work?

Helicopter AEM systems carry transmitter and receiver coils mounted in a frame that hangs beneath the helicopter. A weak electrical current goes through the transmitter coils. The current in the coil makes small, temporary currents in the ground, which in turn make

small, temporary magnetic fields which are detected in the receiver coils hanging beneath the helicopter. If the groundwater changes (if it is deeper or if it is more saline), the magnetic field signals will change. Changes in the magnetic field across the survey help us to better map the groundwater and geology.

The Old Beverley Hospital

A two-page souvenir booklet (below) was produced as a fundraiser by the Hospital Committee in 1930. It was produced by the *Beverley Times* newspaper and sold for sixpence (5¢) at the Annual Sports Carnival.

THE HOSPITAL was opened, under the control of a local Committee, on the 24th June, 1910. The personnel of the Committee is at present as follows: Mr Frank Lodge (Chairman), Messrs. G. E. L. Wrench and H. M. Lawrence (vice-Chairmen), Mesdames M. Adamson, F. Barrett-Lennard, R. Duffield, and G. Sutherland, and Messrs. Ernest Edwards, W. J. Hastings, F. McDonald, J. L. Thomas, E. Ford (Hon. Secretary), and W. L. Price (Treasurer).

THE MATERNITY Section was opened on July 11th, 1924, and the FLEAY MEMORIAL WING on January 27th, 1927.

These additions, together with other improvements carried out since 1923 (including new staff quarters and diningroom, drainage, etc.), have cost about £2 500 and the plant has also increased in value to £850. In these matters the Government has always assisted on the £ for £ basis.

As indicative of the growth and usefulness of the Institution, the following figures are quoted: In 1910 the Income was £350; in 1920 it was £800; and in 1929 it was £2,587, and the records further showed 3,448 Patient Days.

Following is a list of names of the various Matrons who have been in charge since 1910: Mrs. Mills, Misses Despard, Inglis, Clifton, Ballantyne, Piercy, Fox, Brown, Mrs. McLeod, Misses Clifton, Attwood, Parsons, Davis, and the Matron now in charge, Miss Worthington.

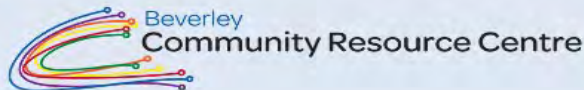

Rachel Kooi Lang Beh, aka Rachel Waller, joins us at the Station from March 19 - April 14. Born in Penang, Malaysia, Rachel is an award-winning textile artist turned painter. Since picking up the paint brush in 2020, she has never looked back. Drawing

inspiration from her surrounds, and also diving deep into her senses, lived experiences of a cross-cultural background, Rachel is most at home when painting intuitively, much like she used to as a textile artist.



Jo Rhodes will also be residing at the Station with Rachel. Coming from a family line of milliners and tailors, Jo is a talented maker using locally sourced Alpaca fleeces from locations in the South West of WA. Jo hand processes

the fleeces to spin into yarns which are used for knitting, crochet and weaving into bespoke knits and accessories. The hand processed fleeces are also used in the making of Jo's signature, sought after range of hand felted hats.

During the residency there will be spinning, weaving and tapestry weaving demonstrations using a variety of

fibres and materials. Jo will also have her rigid heddle loom warped up for people to "have a go", and some little card looms for visitors to do a tiny woven tapestry that they can take home.

WORKSHOP: Rachel and Jo have not made formal arrangements for workshops but welcome people to join them with their own work or needing advice on anything connected to painting or textiles. Or, you may simply like to watch then maybe have a go at weaving or felting. The exhibition of their works is amazing!



Carolyn Rhodes-Thompson will be joining her sister-in-law Jo Rhodes for a night then staying on as AiR till the end of April. We are so fortunate to have Carolyn at the Station over Easter as she's so familiar with the

town. Carolyn is a local WA artist and teacher of 40 years who has taken her inspiration from her childhood country background whilst living in Lake King. Colour, texture and the use of light are very important elements of her paintings as they promote a sense of space, atmosphere and mood. 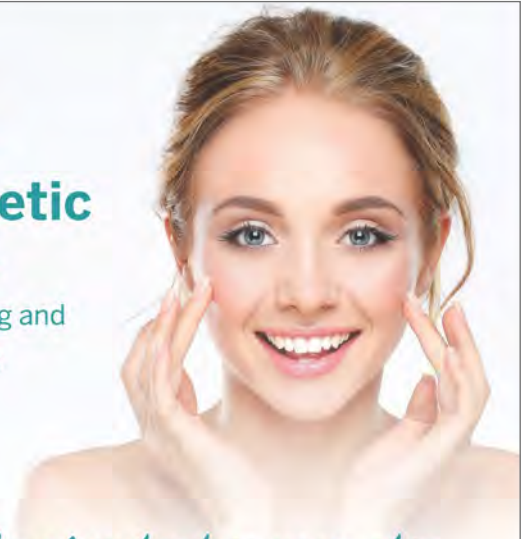

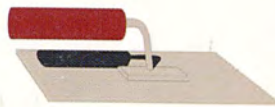

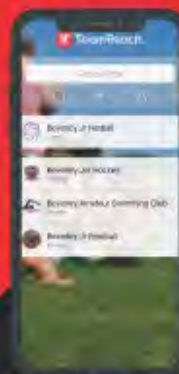
